

## LEGISLATION PENDING IN THE SENATE

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- H.R. 1**—To amend the Civil Rights Act of 1964 to restore and strengthen civil rights laws that ban discrimination in employment, and for other purposes. “Civil Rights and Women’s Equity in Employment Act of 1991”. Placed on the Senate Calendar July 8, 1991. (Superseded by S. 1745).
- H.R. 7**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to require a waiting period before the purchase of a handgun. “Brady Handgun Violence Prevention Act”. Placed on the Senate Calendar June 3, 1991.
- H.R. 26**—To require the Federal depository institution regulatory agencies to take additional enforcement actions against depository institutions engaging in money laundering, and for other purposes. “Money Laundering Enforcement Amendments of 1991”. Placed on the Senate Calendar November 23, 1991.
- H.R. 1206**—To confer jurisdiction on the United States Claims Court with respect to land claims of Pueblo of Isleta Indian Tribe. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary August 5, 1992.
- H.R. 1241**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide penalties for the willful refusal to pay child support, and for other purposes. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary August 6, 1992. (Superseded by S. 1002).
- H.R. 1612**—To amend section 108 of title 17, United States Code, to eliminate the library reproduction reporting requirement. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary November 18, 1991. (Superseded by S. 756).
- H.R. 1760**—To amend the AMVETS charter. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary November 18, 1991.
- H.R. 2039**—To authorize appropriations for the Legal Services Corporation, and for other purposes. “Legal Services Reauthorization Act of 1991”. Placed on the Senate Calendar June 16, 1992.
- H.R. 2372**—To amend title 17, United States Code, with respect to copyright renewal, to reauthorize the National Film Preservation Board, and for other purposes. “Copyright Amendments Act of 1991”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary November 27, 1991. (Superseded by S. 756).
- H.R. 2450**—To amend title 28, United States Code, to provide for Federal jurisdiction of certain multiparty, multiforum, civil actions. “Multiparty, Multiforum Jurisdiction Act of 1991”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary November 27, 1991.
- H.R. 2731**—To amend section 3724 of title 31, United States Code, to extend to the Secretary of the Treasury the authority to settle claims for damages resulting from law enforcement activities of the Customs Service, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms, and the United States Secret Service. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary August 12, 1992.
- H.R. 3048**—To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act with respect to the admission of O and P nonimmigrants. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary November 27, 1991. (Superseded by H.R. 3049).
- H.R. 3088**—To amend title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to authorize funds received by States and units of local government to be expended to improve the quality and availability of DNA records; to authorize the establishment of a DNA identification index; and for other purposes. “DNA Identification Act of 1991”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary October 18, 1992.
- H.R. 3237**—To extend the terms of office of members of the Foreign Claims Settlement Commission from 3 to 6 years. “Foreign Claims Settlement Commission Amendments Act of 1991”. Reported to the Senate, amended, by the Committee on the Judiciary June 11, 1992 (no written report).
- H.R. 3316**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to authorize the Federal Bureau of Investigation to obtain certain telephone subscriber information. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary October 8, 1992.
- H.R. 3341**—To amend the Ethics in Government Act of 1978 with respect to honoraria, and for other purposes. Placed on the Senate Calendar November 27, 1991.

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- H.R. 3591**—To amend the Public Health Service Act to provide protections from legal liability for certain health care professionals providing services pursuant to such Act. “Federally Supported Health Centers Assistance Act of 1991”. Placed on the Senate Calendar September 18, 1992.
- H.R. 3666**—To amend title 28, United States Code, to provide for an additional place for holding court for the Eastern District of Texas. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary November 27, 1991.
- H.R. 3670**—To make certain technical corrections relating to the immigration laws. “Immigration Technical Corrections Act of 1991”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary November 27, 1991. (Superseded by H.R. 3049).
- H.R. 3844**—To assure the protection of certain Haitians in the custody of the United States, and for other purposes. “Haitian Refugee Protection Act of 1991”. Placed on the Senate Calendar March 24, 1992.
- H.R. 4209**—To amend the Act entitled “An Act conferring jurisdiction on certain courts of the United States to hear and render judgment in connection with certain claims of the Cherokee Nation of Oklahoma”, approved December 23, 1982. “Cherokee, Choctaw, and Chickasaw Nations of Oklahoma Claims Act of 1992”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary August 6, 1992.
- H.R. 4563**—To amend the False Claims Act to provide certain limitations on Federal employees filing qui tam actions, and for other purposes. “False Claims Act Technical Amendments of 1992”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary August 12, 1992.
- H.R. 4776**—To amend the Contract Services for Drug Dependent Federal Offenders Act of 1978 to provide additional authorizations of appropriations. “Drug and Alcohol Offenders Treatment Act of 1992”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary August 12, 1992.
- H.R. 4797**—To direct the United States Sentencing Commission to make sentencing guidelines for Federal criminal cases that provide sentencing enhancements for hate crimes. “Hate Crimes Sentencing Enhancement Act of 1992”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary October 8, 1992.
- H.R. 5304**—To provide that a State court may not modify an order of another State court requiring the payment of child support unless the recipient of child support payments resides in the State in which the modification is sought, or consents to seeking the modification in such other State court. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary October 8, 1992.
- H.R. 5475**—Providing policies with respect to approval of bills providing for patent term extensions, and to extend certain patents. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary August 6, 1992.
- H.R. 5555**—To provide for increased preinspection at foreign airports, to make permanent the visa waiver pilot program, and to provide for expedited airport immigration processing. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary September 29, 1992.
- H.R. 6017**—To implement for the United States the United Nations Convention Against Torture and Other Cruel Inhumane or Degrading Treatment or Punishment. Referred to the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations October 5, 1992.
- H.R. 6048**—To require the Federal depository institution regulatory agencies to take additional enforcement actions against depository institutions engaging in money laundering, and for other purposes. “Financial Institutions Enforcement Act”. Referred to the Senate Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs October 8, 1992.
- H.J.Res. 207**—Commemorating the seventy-fifth anniversary of the chartering, by an Act of Congress, of the Boy Scouts of America. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary June 13, 1991. (Superseded by S.J.Res. 111).
- H.J.Res. 454**—To provide for the expeditious disclosure of records relevant to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. “Assassination Materials Disclosure Act of 1992”. Referred to the Senate Committee on Governmental Affairs September 23, 1992. (Superseded by S. 3006).
- H.Con.Res. 89**—Expressing the sense of Congress that expert testimony concerning the nature and effect of domestic violence, including descriptions of the experiences of battered women, should be admissible when offered in a State court by a defendant in a criminal case. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary October 8, 1992.
- H.Con.Res. 320**—Declaring the ratification of the proposed amendment to the Constitution relating to compensation for Representatives and Senators. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary May 21, 1992.
