

LEGISLATION PENDING BEFORE THE FULL COMMITTEE*

- H.R. 926**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to permit Federal prisoners to engage in community service projects. “Prisoner Service Opportunity Act of 1997”. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on Crime March 6, 1997.
- H.R. 2413**—To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act; title 18, United States Code; the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996; and the Immigration Act of 1990 to make technical corrections to such statutes. “Immigration Technical Corrections Act of 1997”. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims September 8, 1997.
- H.R. 2837**—To reform the naturalization process, to clarify the procedures for investigating the criminal background of individuals submitting applications in connection with certain benefits under the Immigration and Nationality Act, and for other purposes. “Naturalization Reform Act of 1997”. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims June 11, 1998.
- H.R. 3206**—To amend the Fair Housing Act. “Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1998”. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on the Constitution February 25, 1998.
- H.R. 3210**—To amend title 17, United States Code, to reform the copyright law with respect to satellite retransmissions of broadcast signals, and for other purposes. “Copyright Compulsory License Improvement Act”. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on Courts and Intellectual Property March 18, 1998.
- H.R. 3410**—To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to establish a 24-month pilot program permitting certain aliens to be admitted into the United States to provide temporary or seasonal agricultural services pursuant to a labor condition attestation and to offset those admissions with temporary reductions in diversity and unskilled workers’ immigrant visas. “Temporary Agricultural Worker Act of 1998”. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims March 12, 1998.
- H.R. 3745**—To prevent money laundering. “Money Laundering Act of 1998”. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on Crime June 5, 1998.
- H.R. 4019**—To protect religious liberty. “Religious Liberty Protection Act of 1998”. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on the Constitution August 6, 1998.
- H.R. 4264**—To establish the Bureau of Enforcement and Border Affairs within the Department of Justice. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims July 30, 1998.
- H.R. 4427**—To amend title 18 of the United States Code with respect to gambling on the Internet, and for other purposes. “Internet Gambling Prohibition Act of 1998”. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on Crime September 14, 1998.
- H.J.Res. 1**—Proposing an amendment to the Constitution to provide for a balanced budget for the United States Government and for greater accountability in the enactment of tax legislation. Held at the full Committee January 28, 1997. Considered by the full Committee February 5, 1997.
- S. 170**—To provide for a process to authorize the use of clone pagers, and for other purposes. “Clone Pager Authorization Act of 1996”. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on Crime May 7, 1998.

SUPERSEDED LEGISLATION

- H.R. 2412**—To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to modify the religious worker visa programs and to extend the visa waiver pilot program, and to amend the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996 to modify the effective date for certain paperwork changes in the employer sanctions program. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims September 8, 1997. (*Superseded by S. 1198, which passed the House October 6, 1997*).

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- H.R. 3209**—To amend title 17, United States Code, to limit liability for copyright infringement for on-line material. “On-Line Copyright Infringement Liability Limitation Act”. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on Courts and Intellectual Property February 26, 1998. (*Superseded by H.R. 2281, the “WIPO Copyright Treaties Implementation Act”, April 1, 1998*).
- H.R. 3843**—To grant a Federal charter to the American GI Forum of the United States. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims June 23, 1998. (*Superseded by S. 1759, which passed the House August 3, 1998*).
- H.R. [blank]**—Internet taxation. Original bill ordered introduced and forwarded to the full Committee by the Subcommittee on Commercial and Administrative October 9, 1997. (*Superseded by H.R. 3529*).

FAILED/TABLED LEGISLATION

- H.R. 1909**—To provide for equal protection of the law and to prohibit discrimination and preferential treatment on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in Federal actions, and for other purposes. “Civil Rights Act of 1997”. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on the Constitution July 9, 1997. Tabled by the full Committee November 6, 1997.
- H.R. 3168**—To clarify that bail bond sureties and bounty hunters are subject to both civil and criminal liability for violations of Federal rights under existing Federal civil rights law, and for other purposes. “Citizen Protection Act of 1998”. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on the Constitution April 30, 1998. Failed to be ordered reported, amended, by the full Committee May 6, 1998 (*11 yeas; 12 nays*).
- H.J.Res. [blank]**—Expressing the sense of Congress with respect to the censure of William Jefferson Clinton. Held at the full Committee. Failed to be ordered reported by the full Committee December 12, 1998 (*14 yeas; 22 nays; 1 “present”*).
