S.J. Res. 22

Mar. 4, 1997

MR. LOTT

To express the sense of the Congress concerning the application by the Attorney General for the appointment of an independent counsel to investigate allegations of illegal fundraising in the 1996 Presidential election campaign.

Mar. 4, 1997—Read the first time in the Senate.

Mar. 5, 1997—Read the second time and placed on the Senate Calendar.

Mar. 14, 17, 18, 1997—Considered by the Senate.

Mar. 19, 1997—Passed the Senate. (*55 yeas; 44 nays; 1 "present"*).

Mar. 19, 1997—Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.

May 5, 1997—Held at the full Committee.

Granting the consent of Congress to the Pacific Northwest Emergency Management Arrangement.

July 21, 1997—Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary.

July 16, 1998—Reported favorably to the Senate by Mr. Hatch. (No written report).

July 31, 1998—Passed the Senate.

Aug. 3, 1998—Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.

Aug. 7, 1998—Referred to the Subcommittee on Commercial and Administrative Law.

Oct. 15, 1998—House Committee on the Judiciary discharged from further consideration.

Oct. 15, 1998—Passed the House under suspension of the rules, two-thirds affirmative vote required.

Nov. 2, 1998—Presented to the President.

Nov. 12, 1998—Approved by the President. **Public Law 105-381.**

Granting the consent of Congress to the Potomac Highlands Airport Authority Compact entered into between the States of Maryland and West Virginia.

June 10, 1998—Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary.

July 30, 1998—Reported favorably to the Senate by Mr. Hatch. (No written report).

July 31, 1998—Passed the Senate.

Aug. 3, 1998—Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.

Aug. 6, 1998—Referred to the Subcommittee on Commercial and Administrative Law.

Sept. 25, 1998—Subcommittee hearing. (**Serial No. 103**).

Sept. 25, 1998—Subcommittee mark-up. Ordered favorably reported to the full Committee.

Oct. 9 (legislative day of Oct. 8), 1998—House Committee on the Judiciary discharged from further consideration.

Oct. 9 (legislative day of Oct. 8), 1998—Passed the House under suspension of the rules, two-thirds affirmative vote required.

Oct. 21, 1998—Presented to the President.

Nov. 2, 1998—Approved by the President. **Public Law 105-348.**
