

LEGISLATION PENDING BEFORE THE FULL COMMITTEE*

- H.R. 102**—To provide grants to grassroots organizations in certain cities to develop youth intervention models. “National Youth Crime Prevention Demonstration Act”. Subcommittee on Crime discharged May 14, 1999. (*Considered May 20, 1999*).
- H.R. 218**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to exempt qualified current and former law enforcement officers from State laws prohibiting the carrying of concealed handguns. “Community Protection Act of 1999”. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on Crime July 1, 1999.
- H.R. 771**—To amend rule 30 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure to restore the stenographic preference for recording depositions. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on Courts and Intellectual Property March 11, 1999.
- H.R. 881**—To provide that under certain conditions no sanction shall be imposed on a person by an agency for a violation of a rule and no civil or criminal sanction may be imposed by a court for a violation of a rule. “Regulatory Fair Warning Act of 1999”. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on Commercial and Administrative Law September 29, 1999.
- H.R. 1604**—To reauthorize, and modify the conditions for, the consent of Congress to the Northeast Interstate Dairy Compact and to grant the consent of Congress to the Southern Dairy Compact. “Dairy Consumers and Producers Protection Act”. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on Commercial and Administrative Law July 30, 1999.
- H.R. 2100**—To amend the Trademark Act of 1946 to prohibit the unauthorized destruction, modification, or alteration of product identification codes, and for other purposes. “Antitampering Act of 1999”. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on Courts and Intellectual Property March 23, 2000.
- H.R. 2558**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to reform Federal Prison Industries, and for other purposes. “Prison Industries Reform Act of 1999”. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on Crime September 23, 1999.
- H.R. 3918**—To establish the Bureau of Immigration Services and the Bureau of Immigration Enforcement within the Department of Justice. “Immigration Reorganization and Improvement Act of 1999”. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims March 22, 2000.
- H.R. 5285**—To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to prevent human rights abusers from being eligible for admission into the United States and other forms of immigration relief, and for other purposes. “Serious Human Rights Abusers Accountability Act of 2000”. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims October 3, 2000.
- H.R. 5377**—To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to extend the limitation on waivers granted under section 212(h) of the Act to aliens unlawfully present in the United States. Original bill introduced and forwarded October 4, 2000, by the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims (language agreed upon October 3, 2000).
- H.R. 5378**—To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to clarify the special rule relating to continuous residence or physical presence under section 240(A)(d) of that Act. Original bill introduced and forwarded October 4, 2000, by the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims (language agreed upon October 3, 2000).
- H.R. 5379**—To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to clarify the provisions applicable to arrest, detention, and release of criminal aliens pending removal decisions. Original bill introduced and forwarded October 4, 2000, by the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims (language agreed upon October 3, 2000).

SUPERSEDED LEGISLATION

- H.R. 915**—To authorize a cost of living adjustment in the pay of administrative law judges. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on Commercial and Administrative Law May 27, 1999. Committee on the Judiciary discharged from further consideration June 10, 1999. Re-referred to the Committee on Government Reform June 10, 1999.

- H.R. 1852**—To amend title 28, United States Code, to allow a judge to whom a case is transferred to retain jurisdiction over certain multidistrict litigation cases for trial. “Multidistrict Trial Jurisdiction Act of 1999”. Ordered reported by the Subcommittee on Courts and Intellectual Property March 20, 1999. (*Superseded by H.R. 2112*).
- H.R. 2528**—To establish the Bureau of Immigration Services and the Bureau of Immigration Enforcement within the Department of Justice. “Immigration Reorganization and Improvement Act of 1999”. Ordered reported, amended, by the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims November 4, 1999. (*Superseded by H.R. 3918*).
