

LEGISLATION PENDING IN THE SENATE

- H.R. 1915**—To provide grants to the States to improve the reporting of unidentified and mission persons. “Jennifer’s Law”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary June 8, 1999.
- H.R. 2005**—To establish a statute of repose for durable goods used in a trade or business. “Workplace Goods Job Growth and Competitiveness Act of 1999”. Referred to the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science and Transportation February 3, 2000.
- H.R. 2014**—To prohibit a State from imposing a discriminatory commuter tax on nonresidents. Referred to the Senate Committee on Finance June 30, 1999.
- H.R. 2260**—To amend the Controlled Substances Act to promote pain management and palliative care without permitting assisted suicide and euthanasia, and for other purposes. “Pain Relief Promotion Act of 1999”. Reported to the Senate, amended, by the Committee on the Judiciary (S.Rept. 106-299).
- H.R. 2366**—To provide small businesses certain protections from litigation excesses and to limit the product liability of nonmanufacturer product sellers. “Small Business Liability Reform Act of 1999”. Placed on the Senate Calendar March 28, 2000.
- H.R. 2372**—To simplify and expedite access to the Federal courts for injured parties whose rights and privileges, secured by the United States Constitution, have been deprived by final actions of Federal agencies, or other government officials or entities acting under color of State law; to prevent Federal courts from abstaining from exercising Federal jurisdiction in actions where no State law claim is alleged; to permit certification of unsettled State law questions that are essential to resolving Federal claims arising under the Constitution; and to clarify when government action is sufficiently final to ripen certain Federal claims arising under the Constitution. “Private Property Rights Implementation Act of 1999”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary March 21, 2000.
- H.R. 2436**—To amend title 18, United States Code, and the Uniform Code of Military Justice to protect unborn children from assault and murder, and for other purposes. “Unborn Victims of Violence Act of 1999”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary October 1, 1999.
- H.R. 2634**—To amend the Controlled Substances Act with respect to registration requirements for practitioners who dispense narcotic drugs in schedule IV or V for maintenance treatment or detoxification treatment. “Drug Addiction Treatment Act of 1999”. Placed on the Senate Calendar July 27, 2000.
- H.R. 2904**—To amend the Ethics in Government Act of 1978 to reauthorize funding for the Office of Government Ethics. Placed on the Senate Calendar November 19, 1999.
- H.R. 3088**—To amend the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to provide additional protections to victims of rape. “Victims of Rape Health Protection Act”. Received in the Senate October 3, 2000.
- H.R. 3164**—To provide for the imposition of economic sanctions on certain foreign persons engaging in, or otherwise involved in, international narcotics trafficking. “Foreign Narcotics Kingpin Designation Act”. Referred to the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations November 19, 1999.
- H.R. 3312**—To clarify the Administrative Dispute Resolution Act of 1996 to authorize the Merit Systems Protection Board to establish under such Act a 3-year pilot program that will provide a voluntary early intervention alternative dispute resolution process to assist Federal agencies and employees in resolving certain personnel actions and disputes in administrative programs. “Merit Systems Protection Board Administrative Dispute Resolution Act of 1999”. Received in the Senate October 25, 2000.
- H.R. 3484**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide that certain sexual crimes against children are predicate crimes for the interception of communications, and for other purposes. “Child Sex Crimes Wiretapping Act of 1999”. Received in the Senate October 4, 2000.
- H.R. 3615**—To amend the Rural Electrification Act of 1936 to ensure improved access to the signals of local television stations by multichannel video providers to all households which desire such service in unserved and underserved rural areas by December 31, 2006. “Rural Local Broadcast Signal Act”. Placed on the Senate Calendar May 2, 2000.
- H.R. 3660**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to ban partial-birth abortions. “Partial-Birth Abortion Ban Act of 2000”. Placed on the Senate Calendar May 25, 2000.
- H.R. 3709**—To make permanent the moratorium enacted by the Internet Tax Freedom Act as it applies to new, multiple, and discriminatory taxes on the Internet. “Internet Nondiscrimination Act”. Placed on the Senate Calendar May 18, 2000.
- H.R. 3879**—To support the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone in its peace-building efforts, and for other purposes. “Sierra Leone Peace Support Act of 2000”. Referred to the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations May 4, 2000.

LEGISLATION PENDING IN THE SENATE

- H.R. 4047**—To amend title 18 of the United States Code to provide life imprisonment for repeat offenders who commit sex offenses against children. “Two Strikes and You’re Out Child Protection Act”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary July 26, 2000.
- H.R. 4051**—To establish a grant program that provides incentives for States to enact mandatory minimum sentences for certain firearms offenses, and for other purposes. “Project Exile: The Safe Streets and Neighborhoods Act of 2000”. Placed on the Senate Calendar May 25, 2000.
- H.R. 4147**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to increase the age of persons considered to be minors for the purposes of the prohibition on transporting obscene materials to minors. “Stop Material Unsuitable for Teens Act”. Received in the Senate October 3, 2000.
- H.R. 4292**—To protect infants who are born alive. “Born-Alive Infant Protection Act of 2000”. Read the first time in the Senate October 5, 2000.
- H.R. 4678**—To provide more child support money to families leaving welfare, to simplify the rules governing the assignment and distribution of child support collected by States on behalf of children, to improve the collection of child support, to promote marriage, and for other purposes. “Child Support Distribution Act of 2000”. Referred to the Senate Committee on Finance September 8, 2000.
- H.R. 4710**—To authorize appropriations for the prosecution of obscenity cases. “Illegal Pornography Prosecution Act of 2000”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary July 26, 2000.
- H.R. 4718**—To extend for 3 additional months the period for which chapter 12 of title 11 of the United States Code is reenacted. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary July 27, 2000.
- H.R. 4870**—To make technical corrections in patent, copyright, and trademark laws. “Intellectual Property Technical Amendments Act of 2000”. Received in the Senate September 20, 2000.
- H.R. 4888**—To protect innocent children. “Innocent Child Protection Act of 2000”. Placed on the Senate Calendar September 5, 2000.
- H.R. 4999**—To control crime by providing law enforcement block grants. “Local Government Law Enforcement Block Grants Act of 2000”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary September 20, 2000.
- H.R. 5062**—To establish the eligibility of certain aliens lawfully admitted for permanent residence for cancellation of removal under section 240A of the Immigration and Nationality Act. Received in the Senate September 20, 2000.
- H.R. 5106**—To make technical corrections in copyright law. “Copyright Technical Corrections Act of 2000”. Received in the Senate September 20, 2000.
- H.R. 5136**—To make permanent the authority of the Marshal of the Supreme Court and the Supreme Court Police to provide security beyond the Supreme Court building and grounds. Received in the Senate October 11, 2000.
- H.R. 5174**—To amend titles 10 and 18, United States Code, and the Revised Statutes to remove the uncertainty regarding the authority of the Department of Defense to permit buildings located on military installations and reserve component facilities to be used as polling places in Federal, State, and local elections for public office. Received in the Senate October 13, 2000.
- H.R. 5312**—To amend the Controlled Substances Act to protect children from drug traffickers. “Protecting Our Children From Drugs Act of 2000”. Received in the Senate October 18, 2000.
- H.R. 5540**—To extend for 11 additional months the period for which chapter 12 of title 11 of the United States Code is reenacted. Received in the Senate November 1, 2000.
- H.R. 5562**—To amend title 28, United States Code, to allow a judge to whom a case is transferred to retain jurisdiction over certain multidistrict litigation cases for trial. “Multidistrict Litigation Act of 2000”. Received in the Senate December 15, 2000.
- H.J.Res. 33**—Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States authorizing the Congress to prohibit the physical desecration of the flag of the United States. Placed on the Senate Calendar June 28, 1999.
- H.Con.Res. 93**—Expressing the sense of the Congress regarding the social problem of child abuse and neglect and supporting efforts to enhance public awareness of this problem. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary May 4, 1999.

LEGISLATION PENDING IN THE SENATE

- H.Con.Res. 124**—Expressing the sense of the Congress relating to recent allegations of espionage and illegal campaign financing that have brought into question the loyalty and probity of Americans of Asian ancestry. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary November 19, 1999.
- H.Con.Res. 180**—Expressing the sense of Congress that the President should not have granted clemency to terrorists. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary September 29, 1999.
- H.Con.Res. 199**—Expressing the sense of the Congress that prayers and invocations at public school sporting events contribute to the moral foundation of our Nation and urging the Supreme Court to uphold their constitutionality. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary November 19, 1999.

SUPERSEDED LEGISLATION

- H.R. 894**—To encourage States to incarcerate individuals convicted of murder, rape, or child molestation. “No Second Chances for Murderers, Rapists, or Child Molesters Act of 1999” or “Aimee’s Law”. Placed on the Senate Calendar July 13, 2000. (*Superseded by H.R. 3244*).
- H.R. 1189**—To make technical corrections in title 17, United States Code, and other laws. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary April 14, 1999. (*Superseded by S. 1260*).
- H.R. 1248**—To prevent violence against women. “Violence Against Women Act of 1999”. Placed on the Senate Calendar September 27, 2000. (*Superseded by H.R. 3244*).
- H.R. 1691**—To protect religious liberty. “Religious Liberty Protection Act of 1999”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary November 19, 1999. (*Superseded by S. 2869*).
- H.R. 1714**—To facilitate the use of electronic records and signatures in interstate or foreign commerce. “Electronic Signatures in Global and National Commerce Act”. Referred to the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science and Transportation November 19, 1999. (*Superseded by S. 761*).
- H.R. 1752**—To make improvements in the operation and administration of the Federal courts, and for other purposes. “Federal Courts Improvement Act of 1999”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary May 23, 2000. (*Superseded by S. 2915*).
- H.R. 1907**—To amend title 35, United States Code, to provide enhanced protection for inventors and innovators, protect patent terms, reduce patent litigation, and for other purposes. “American Inventors Protection Act of 1999”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary October 8, 1999. (*Superseded by H.R. 1554*).
- H.R. 2031**—To provide for injunctive relief in Federal district court to enforce State laws relating to the interstate transportation of intoxicating liquor. “Twenty-First Amendment Enforcement Act”. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary August 4, 1999. (*Superseded by H.R. 3244*).
- H.R. 2942**—To extend for 6 additional months the period for which chapter 12 of title 11 of the United States Code is reenacted. Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary September 28, 1999. (*Superseded by S. 1606*).
- H.R. 3485**—To modify the enforcement of certain anti-terrorism judgments, and for other purposes. “Justice for Victims of Terrorism Act”. Placed on the Senate Calendar July 26, 2000. (*Superseded by H.R. 3244*).
- H.R. 4033**—To amend the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to clarify the procedures and conditions for the award of matching grants for the purchase of armor vests. “Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant Act of 2000”. Placed on the Senate Calendar September 5, 2000. (*Superseded by S. 2413*).
- S. 1255**—To protect consumers and promote electronic commerce by amending certain trademark infringement, dilution, and counterfeiting laws, and for other purposes. “Anticybersquatting Consumer Protection Act”. Passed the House October 26, 1999, and returned to the Senate amended. (*Superseded by H.R. 1554*).
