### H. Res. 101

Mar. 9, 1999

MR. THOMAS

Providing amounts for the expenses of certain committees of the House of Representatives in the One Hundred Sixth Congress.

Mar. 9, 1999—Referred to the Committee on House Administration.  
Mar. 16, 1999—Full Committee mark-up. Ordered favorably reported to the House, amended.  
Mar. 22, 1999—Reported favorably to the House, amended, by Mr. Thomas. (H.Rept. 106-72) (House Calendar).  
Mar. 23, 1999 Mr. Hoyer moved to recommit with instructions to House Administration.  
Mar. 23, 1999—The House rejected a motion to recommit H.Res. 101 to the Committee on House Administration with instructions to report the resolution back to the House, as amended by the House, but with substitute language for sections 1, 2, 3, and 6 providing for one-third allocation of funds to the minority. (205 yeas; 218 nays).  
Mar. 23, 1999—Agreed to by the House, as amended. (216 yeas; 210 nays).

Designating majority membership on certain standing committees of the House. (Joe Scarborough, Florida).

Mar. 11, 1999—Considered by the House as a privileged matter.
