Memorial of the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, relative to Legislative Resolution No. 10, petitioning Congress of the United States to propose to the States an amendment to Article I, section 2 of the United States Constitution that would increase the length of the terms of office for Members of the House of Representatives from two years to four years with one-half of the Members' terms expiring every two years.
- 41** **Apr. 29, 1999**
Memorial of the Senate of the State of Idaho, relative to Senate Joint Memorial No. 102 memorializing the Congress to implement procedures similiar to the procedure employed by the State of Idaho which requires all rules proposed by executive agencies to be submitted to the Legislature of the State of Idaho for final approval before such administrative law may become effective. Referred jointly to the Committee on the Judiciary and the Committee on Government Reform.
- 42** **Apr. 29, 1999**
Memorial of the House of Delegates of the Commonwealth of Virginia, relative to House Joint Resolution No. 649 memorializing that availability and unfettered usage of strong encryption technology for any legitimate purpose will enable and facilitate the growth of the information economy and therefore should be encouraged and supported by government at all levels. Referred jointly to the Committees on International Law, Commerce, and the Judiciary.

Memorial of the House of Delegates of the Commonwealth of Virginia, relative to House Joint Resolution No. 499 memorializing the General Assembly of Virginia to reaffirm its notice to the federal government that the Commonwealth strongly opposes any effort to weaken the powers reserved to the States and the people by the 10th Amendment of the Constitution of the United States.

 Memorial of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Virginia, relative to Senate Joint Resolution No. 255 memorializing Congress to protect Virginia's dairy industry by approving the Southern Dairy Compact and ensuring that the Federal Clean Water Act is implemented in a way that does not place an undue burden on farmers.  Memorial of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Virginia, relative to House Joint Resolution No. 71 memorializing the Congress of the United States to propose an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to allow for voluntary school prayer.

 Memorial of the Legislature of the State of Louisiana, relative to House Concurrent Resolution No. 9 memorializing the United States Congress to consider the needs of State and local governments and traditional "main street" merchants when determining the proper course of action regarding Internet taxation.

 Memorial of the Legislature of the State of Louisiana, relative to House Resolution No. 33 memorializing the United States Congress to take such steps as necessary to preserve the liberties of our nation as a whole and the liberties of the individual citizens of our nation.

 Memorial of the Legislature of the State of New Hampshire, relative to House Joint Resolution No. 20 memorializing the United States Congress to fully fund the Ricky Ray Hemophilia Relief Fund Act for HIV victims.

 Memorial of the Senate of the State of Illinois, relative to Senate Resolution No. 216 memorializing the Congress of the United States to propose submission to the States for their ratification an amendment to the Constitution of the United States Supreme Court or any inferior court of the United States to mandate any State or political subdivision of the State levy or increase taxes.

 Memorial of the Legislature of the State of New Hampshire, relative to House Concurrent Resolution No. 27 memorializing Congress to propose an amendment to the U.S. Constitution to prevent Federal courts from instructing States or political subdivisions of States to levy or increase taxes.

 Memorial of the Legislature of the State of Alaska, relative to CS House Joint Resolution No. 48 L.R. No. 40 memorializing the United States Congress to amend the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996 to exempt from the requirements of sec. 110 of that Act Canadian citizens who enter at land border crossing stations along the border between the United States and Canada; and further requesting that additional resources are provided to adequately facilitate the free flow of people and the fair trade of goods and services across the border between the United States and Canada.

 Memorial of the General Assembly of the State of New Jersey, relative to Assembly Resolution No. 58 memorializing the President and the Congress of the United States to enact H.R. 271 of 1999, the Justice for Holocaust Survivors Act, which would permit U.S. citizens who are victims of the Holocaust, whether or not they were U.S. citizens during World War II, to sue the Federal Republic of Germany for compensation in U.S. courts of law.

 Memorial of the Legislature of the State of New Hampshire, relative to House Joint Resolution memorializing Congress to pass legislation ensuring improved access to local television for households in unserved and underserved rural areas. referred jointly to the Committees on Commerce, Agriculture, and the Judiciary.
- 454** **July 27, 2000**
 Memorial of the Legislature of the Commonwealth of Guam, relative to Resolution No. 368 memorializing the President of the United States to grant clemency to Veteran Alejandro T.B. Lizama, that his sentence be commuted, and that he be released and returned to Guam.
- 455** **July 27, 2000**
 Memorial of the General Assembly of the State of New Jersey, relative to Resolution No. 90 memorializing the United States Congress to acknowledge the Year 2000 as the 35th anniversary of the passage of the Voting Rights Act of 1965.
- 456** **July 27, 2000**
 Memorial of the Legislature of the State of New Hampshire, relative to House Concurrent Resolution No. 24 supporting the integration requirement of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

 Memorial of the Senate of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, relative to Resolution memorializing the Congress of the United States to fully fund the Ricky Ray Hemophilia Relief Fund Act of 1998.

 Memorial of House of Representatives of the State of Texas, relative to a resolution memorializing the U.S. House of Representatives to support S. 2668, the "Family, Work and Immigrant Integration Amendments of 2000".  Memorial of the House of Representatives of the State of Texas, relative to a resolution petitioning the United States House of Representatives to support S. 2912 "To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to remove certain limitations on the eligibility of aliens residing in the United States to obtain lawful permanent resident status".

 Memorial of the House of Representatives of the State of South Carolina, relative to Concurrent Resolution H. 4434 memorializing the United States Congress to amend the Constitution of the United States and submit to the States for ratification an amendment which adds a new article providing as follows: "Neither the Supreme Court nor any inferior court of the United States shall have the power to instruct or order a State or political subdivision thereof, or an official of such a State or political subdivision, to levy or increase taxes".

Memorial of the Senate of the State of Ohio, relative to Senate Joint Resolution 11 memorializing the United States Congress to take the action necessary to propose, and submit to the several States for ratification, an amendment to the Constitution of the United States that would prohibit the desecration of the American flag.

Memorial of the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, relative to Resolution 47 memorializing that the United States Congress prepare and submit to the several States an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to add a new article providing as follows: Neither the Supreme Court nor any inferior court of the United States shall have the power to instruct or order a State or a political subdivision, to levy or increase taxes.

Memorial of the Senate of the State of Texas, relative to Senate resolution No. 1106, memorializing the United States Congress to fully fund the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program at the authorized level.
