First Session

March 21, 2001—Mark-up of: **H.R. 503**—To amend title 18, United States Code, and the Uniform Code of Military Justice to protect unborn children from assault and murder, and for other purposes—“Unborn Victims of Violence Act of 2001”—Ordered reported to the Full Committee without amendment (voice vote).

May 24, 2001—Mark-up of: **H.J.Res. 36**—Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States authorizing the Congress to prohibit desecration of the flag of the United States—Ordered reported to the Full Committee without amendment (5 yeas, 3 nays).

July 12, 2001—Mark-up of: **H.R. 2175**—To protect infants who are born alive—“Born-Alive Infants Protection Act of 2001”—Ordered reported to the Full Committee without amendment (voice vote).

Second Session

February 7, 2002—Mark-up of: **H.R. 476**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to prohibit taking minors across State lines in circumvention of laws requiring the involvement of parents in abortion decisions—“Child Custody Protection Act”—Ordered reported to the Full Committee without amendment (voice vote).

July 11, 2002—Mark-up of: **H.R. 4965**—To prohibit the procedure commonly known as partial-birth abortion—“Partial-Birth Abortion Ban Act of 2002”—Ordered reported to the Full Committee without amendment (8 yeas; 3 nays).
