

LEGISLATION PASSED BY THE HOUSE

- H.R. 1**—To close the achievement gap with accountability, flexibility, and choice, so that no child is left behind. “No Child Left Behind Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, May 23, 2001 (384 ayes; 45 noes). (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 4**—To enhance energy conservation, research and development and to provide for security and diversity in the energy supply for the American people, and for other purposes. “Securing America’s Future Energy Act of 2001” or the “SAFE Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, August 2 (legislative day August 1), 2001 (240 yeas; 189 nays). (*Committee named to conference*).
- H.R. 7**—To provide incentives for charitable contributions by individuals and businesses, to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of government program delivery to individuals and families in need, and to enhance the ability of low-income Americans to gain financial security by building assets. “Community Choice Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, July 19, 2001 (233 yeas; 198 nays).
- H.R. 169**—To require that Federal agencies be accountable for violations of antidiscrimination and whistleblower protection laws, and for other purposes. “Notification and Federal Employee Antidiscrimination and Retaliation Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, October 2, 2001 (420 yeas; 0 nays).
- H.R. 256**—To extend for 11 additional months the period for which chapter 12 of title 11 of the United States Code is reenacted. Passed the House February 28, 2001 (408 yeas; 2 nays).
- H.R. 333**—To amend title 11 of the United States Code, and for other purposes. “Bankruptcy Abuse Prevention and Consumer Protection Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, March 1, 2001 (306 yeas; 108 nays).
- H.R. 476**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to prohibit taking minors across State lines in circumvention of laws requiring the involvement of parents in abortion decisions. “Child Custody Protection Act”. Passed the House April 17, 2002 (260 yeas; 161 noes).
- H.R. 503**—To amend title 18, United States Code, and the Uniform Code of Military Justice to protect unborn children from assault and murder, and for other purposes. “Unborn Victims of Violence Act of 2001”. Passed the House April 26, 2001 (252 yeas; 172 nays; 1 “present”).
- H.R. 556**—To prevent the use of certain bank instruments for unlawful Internet gambling, and for other purposes. “Unlawful Internet Gambling Funding Prohibition Act”. Passed the House, amended, October 1, 2002, by voice vote. (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 741**—To amend the Trademark Act of 1946 to provide for the registration and protection of trademarks used in commerce, in order to carry out provisions of certain international conventions, and for other purposes. “Madrid Protocol Implementation Act”. Passed the House March 14, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 768**—To amend the Improving America’s Schools Act of 1994 to make permanent the favorable treatment of need-based educational aid under the antitrust laws. “Need-Based Educational Aid Act of 2001”. Passed the House April 3, 2001 (414 yeas; 0 nays).
- H.R. 802**—To authorize the Public Safety Officer Medal of Valor, and for other purposes. “Public Safety Officer Medal of Valor Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, March 22, 2001 (414 yeas; 0 nays).
- H.R. 809**—To make technical corrections to various antitrust laws and to references to such laws. “Antitrust Technical Corrections Act of 2001”. Passed the House March 14, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 860**—To amend title 28, United States Code, to allow a judge to whom a case is transferred to retain jurisdiction over certain multidistrict litigation cases for trial, and to provide for Federal jurisdiction of certain multiparty, multiforum civil actions. “Multidistrict, Multiparty, Multiforum Trial Jurisdiction Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, March 14, 2001, by voice vote.

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- H.R. 861**—To make technical amendments to section 10 of title 9, United States Code. Passed the House March 14, 2001 (413 yeas; 0 nays).
- H.R. 863**—To provide grants to ensure increased accountability for juvenile offenders. “Consequences for Juvenile Offenders Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, October 16, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 1022**—To amend title 4, United States Code, to make sure the rules of etiquette for flying the flag of the United States do not preclude the flying of flags at half mast when ordered by city and local officials. Passed the House, amended, December 12, 2001 (420 yeas; 0 nays).
- H.R. 1209**—To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to determine whether an alien is a child, for purposes of classification as an immediate relative, based on the age of the alien on the date the classification petition with respect to the alien is filed, and for other purposes. “Child Status Protection Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, June 6, 2001 (416 yeas; 0 nays).
- H.R. 1408**—To safeguard the public from fraud in the financial services industry, to streamline and facilitate the antifraud information-sharing efforts of Federal and State regulators, and for other purposes. “Financial Services Antifraud Network Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, November 6, 2001 (392 yeas; 4 nays).
- H.R. 1448**—To clarify the tax treatment of bonds and other obligations issued by the Government of American Samoa. Passed the House, amended, September 24, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 1542**—To deregulate the Internet and high speed data services, and for other purposes. “Internet Freedom and Broadband Deployment Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, February 27, 2002 (273 yeas; 157 noes).
- H.R. 1552**—To extend the moratorium enacted by the Internet Tax Freedom Act through 2006, and for other purposes. “Internet Tax Nondiscrimination Act”. Passed the House, amended, October 16, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 1646**—To authorize appropriations for the Department of State for fiscal years 2002 and 2003, and for other purposes. “Foreign Relations Authorization Act, Fiscal years 2002 and 2003”. Passed the House, amended, May 16, 2001 (352 yeas; 73 nays). (*Committee named to conference*).
- H.R. 1701**—To amend the Consumer credit Protection Act to assure meaningful disclosures of the terms or rental-purchase agreements, including disclosures of the costs to consumers under such agreements, to provide certain substantive rights to consumers under such agreements, and for other purposes. “Consumer Rental Purchase Agreement Act”. Passed the House, amended, September 18, 2002 (215 yeas; 201 noes; 1 “present”).
- H.R. 1840**—To extend eligibility for refugee status of unmarried sons and daughters of certain Vietnamese refugees. Passed the House, amended, October 30, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 1866**—To amend title 35, United States Code, to clarify the basis for granting requests for reexamination of patents. Passed the House, amended, September 5, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 1877**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide that certain sexual crimes against children are predicate crimes for the interception of communications, and for other purposes. “Child Sex Crimes Wiretapping Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, May 21, 2002 (396 yeas; 11 nays).
- H.R. 1885**—To expand the class of beneficiaries who may apply for adjustment of status under section 245(i) of the Immigration and Nationality Act by extending the deadline for classification petition and labor certification filings, and for other purposes. “Section 245(i) Extension Act of 2001”. Passed the House May 21, 2001 (336 yeas; 43 nays). (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 1886**—To amend title 35, United States Code, to provide for appeals by third parties in certain patent reexamination proceedings. Passed the House September 5, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 1892**—To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to provide for the acceptance of an affidavit of support from another eligible sponsor if the original sponsor has died and the Attorney General has determined for humanitarian reasons that the original sponsor’s classification petition should not be revoked. “Family Sponsor Immigration Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, July 23, 2001 (379 yeas; 0 nays).
- H.R. 1914**—To extend for 4 additional months the period for which chapter 12 of title 11 of the United States Code is reenacted. Passed the House June 6, 2001 (411 yeas; 1 nay). (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 2047**—To authorize appropriations for the United States Patent and Trademark Office for fiscal year 2002, and for other purposes. “Patent and Trademark Office Authorization Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, November 6, 2001, by voice vote.

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- H.R. 2048**—To require a report on the operation of the State Justice Institute. Passed the House September 5, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 2054**—To give the consent of Congress to an agreement or compact between Utah and Nevada regarding a change in the boundaries of those States. Passed the House, amended, June 11, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 2068**—To revise, codify, and enact without substantive change certain general and permanent laws, related to public buildings, property, and works, as title 40, United States Code, “Public Buildings, Property, and Works”. Passed the House, amended, June 11, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 2137**—To make clerical and other technical amendments to title 18, United States Code, and other laws relating to crime and criminal procedure. “Criminal Law Technical Amendments Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, July 23, 2001 (374 yeas; 0 nays).
- H.R. 2146**—To amend title 18 of the United States Code to provide life imprisonment for repeat offenders who commit sex offenses against children. “Two Strikes and You’re Out Child Protection Act”. Passed the House, amended, March 14, 2002 (382 yeas; 34 nays).
- H.R. 2155**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to make it illegal to operate a motor vehicle with a drug or alcohol in the body of the driver at a land border port of entry, and for other purposes. Passed the House, amended, October 16, 2002 (296 yeas; 94 nays).
- H.R. 2175**—To protect infants who are born alive. “Born-Alive Infants Protection Act of 2001”. Passed the House March 12, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 2215**—To authorize appropriations for the Department of Justice for fiscal year 2002, and for other purposes. “21st Century Department of Justice Appropriations Authorization Act”. Passed the House, amended, July 23, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 2277**—To provide for work authorization for nonimmigrant spouses of treaty traders and treaty investors. Passed the House September 5, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 2278**—To provide for work authorization for nonimmigrant spouses of intracompany transferees, and to reduce the period of time during which certain intracompany transferees have to be continuously employed before applying for admission to the United States. Passed the House September 5, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 2336**—To make permanent the authority to redact financial disclosure statements of judicial employees and judicial officers. Passed the House October 16, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 2341**—To amend the procedures that apply to consideration of interstate class actions to assure fairer outcomes for class members and defendants, to outlaw certain practices that provide inadequate settlements for class members, to assure that attorneys do not receive a disproportionate amount of settlements at the expense of class members, to provide for clearer and simpler information in class action settlement notices, to assure prompt consideration of interstate class actions, to amend title 28, United States Code, to allow the application of the principles of Federal diversity jurisdiction to interstate class actions, and for other purposes. “Class Action Fairness Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, March 13, 2002 (233 yeas; 190 nays).
- H.R. 2356**—To amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to provide bipartisan campaign reform. “Bipartisan Campaign Reform Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, February 14 (legislative day February 13), 2002 (240 yeas; 189 noes). (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 2458**—To enhance the management and promotion of electronic Government services and processes by establishing a Federal Chief Information Officer within the Office of Management and Budget, and by reestablishing a broad framework of measures that require using Internet-based information technology to enhance citizen access to Government information and services, and for other purposes. “E-Government Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, November 15, 2002, by voice vote. (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 2505**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to prohibit human cloning. “Human Cloning Prohibition Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, July 31, 2001 (265 yeas; 165 noes).
- H.R. 2541**—To enhance the authorities of special agents and provide limited authorities to uniformed officers responsible for the protection of domestic Department of State occupied facilities. Passed the House, amended, November 13, 2001 (410 yeas; 0 nays). (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 2559**—To amend chapter 90 of title 5, United States Code, relating to Federal long-term care insurance. Passed the House October 30, 2001 (406 yeas; 1 nay).

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- H.R. 2603**—To implement the agreement establishing a United States-Jordan free trade area. “United States-Jordan Free Trade Area Implementation Act”. Passed the House, amended, July 31, 2001, by voice vote. (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 2621**—To amend title 18, United States Code, with respect to consumer product protection. “Consumer Product Protection Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, June 11, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 2646**—To provide for the continuation of agricultural programs through fiscal year 2011. “Farm Security Act of 2001”. Passed the House October 5, 2001 (291 yeas; 120 nays). (*Committee named to conference*).
- H.R. 2882**—To provide for the expedited payment of certain benefits for a public safety officer who was killed or suffered a catastrophic injury as a direct and proximate result of a personal injury sustained in the line of duty in connection with the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. Passed the House September 13, 2001 (413 yeas; 0 nays). (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 2926**—To preserve the continued viability of the United States air transportation system. “Air Transportation Safety and System Stabilization Act”. Passed the House September 21, 2001 (356 yeas; 54 nays; 2 “present”). (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 2975**—To combat terrorism, and for other purposes. “Provide Appropriate Tools Required to Intercept and Obstruct Terrorism (PATRIOT) Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, October 12, 2001 (337 yeas; 79 nays; 1 “present”).
- H.R. 3004**—To combat the financing of terrorism and other financial crimes, and for other purposes. “Financial Anti-Terrorism Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, October 17, 2001 (412 yeas; 1 nay).
- H.R. 3009**—To extend the Andean Trade Preference Act, to grant additional trade benefits under that Act, and for other purposes. “Andean Trade Promotion and Drug Eradication Act”. Passed the House, amended, November 16, 2001, by voice vote. (*Committee named to conference*).
- H.R. 3030**—To extend the “Basic Pilot” employment verification system, and for other purposes. “Basic Pilot Extension Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, December 11, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.R. 3160**—To amend the Antiterrorism and Effective Death Penalty Act of 1996 with respect to the responsibilities of the Secretary of Health and Human Services regarding biological agents and toxins, and to amend title 18, United States Code, with respect to such agents and toxins. “Bioterrorism Enforcement Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, October 23, 2001 (419 yeas; 0 nays).
- H.R. 3162**—To deter and punish terrorist acts in the United States and around the world, to enhance law enforcement investigatory tools, and for other purposes. “Uniting and Strengthening America by Providing Appropriate Tools Required to Intercept and Obstruct Terrorism (USA PATRIOT ACT) Act of 2001”. Passed the House October 24, 2001 (357 yeas; 66 nays).
- H.R. 3180**—To consent to certain amendments to the New Hampshire-Vermont Interstate School Compact. Passed the House June 26, 2002 (425 yeas; 0 nays).
- H.R. 3209**—To amend title 18, United States Code, with respect to false communications about certain criminal violations, and for other purposes. “Anti-Hoax Terrorism Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, December 12, 2001 (423 yeas; 0 nays).
- H.R. 3210**—To ensure the continued financial capacity of insurers to provide coverage for risks from terrorism. “Terrorism Risk Protection Act”. Passed the House, amended, November 29, 2001 (227 yeas; 193 noes).
- H.R. 3214**—To amend the charter of the AMVETS organization. Passed the House July 15, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 3231**—To replace the Immigration and Naturalization Service with the Agency for Immigration Affairs, and for other purposes. “Barbara Jordan Immigration Reform and Accountability Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, April 25, 2002 (405 yeas; 9 noes).
- H.R. 3275**—To implement the International Convention for the Suppression of Terrorist Bombings to strengthen criminal laws relating to attacks on places of public use, to implement the International Convention of the Suppression of the Financing of Terrorism, to combat terrorism and defend the Nation against terrorist acts, and for other purposes. Passed the House, amended, December 19, 2001 (381 yeas; 36 nays).
- H.R. 3295**—To establish a program to provide funds to States to replace punch card voting systems, to establish the Election Assistance Commission to assist in the administration of Federal elections and to otherwise provide assistance with the administration of certain Federal election laws and programs, to establish minimum election administration standards for States and units of local government with responsibility for the administration of Federal elections, and for other purposes. “Help America Vote Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, December 12, 2001 (362 yeas; 63 nays).

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- H.R. 3297**—To amend the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to ensure that chaplains killed in the line of duty receive public safety officer death benefits. “Mychal Judge Police and Fire Chaplains Public Safety Officers’ Benefit Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, June 11, 2002, by voice vote. (*Superseded by S. 2431 below*).
- H.R. 3375**—To provide compensation for the United States citizens who were victims of the bombings of United States embassies in East Africa on August 7, 1998, on the same basis as compensation is provided to victims of the terrorist-related aircraft crashes on September 11, 2001. “Embassy Employee Compensation Act”. Passed the House May 21, 2002 (391 yeas; 18 nays).
- H.R. 3448**—To improve the ability of the United States to prevent, prepare for, and respond to bioterrorism and other public health emergencies. “Public Health Security and Bioterrorism Response Act of 2001”. Passed the House December 12, 2001 (418 yeas; 2 nays). (*Committee named to conference*).
- H.R. 3482**—To provide greater cybersecurity. “Cyber Security Enhancement Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, July 15, 2002 (385 yeas; 3 nays).
- H.R. 3525**—To enhance the border security of the United States, and for other purposes. “Enhanced Border Security and Visa Entry Reform Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, December 19, 2001, by voice vote. (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 3763**—To protect investors by improving the accuracy and reliability of corporate disclosures made pursuant to the securities laws, and for other purposes. “Corporate and Auditing Accountability, Responsibility, and Transparency Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, April 24, 2002 (334 yeas; 90 nays). (*Committee named to conference*).
- H.R. 3838**—To amend the charter of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States organization to make members of the armed forces who receive special pay for duty subject to hostile fire or imminent danger eligible for membership in the organization, and for other purposes. Passed the House July 15, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 3892**—To amend title 28, United States Code, to make certain modifications in the judicial discipline procedures, and for other purposes. “Judicial Improvements Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, July 22, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 3925**—To establish an exchange program between the Federal Government and the private sector in order to promote the development of expertise in information technology management, and for other purposes. “Digital Tech Corps Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, April 10, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 3988**—To amend title 36, United States Code, to clarify the requirements for eligibility in the American Legion. Passed the House July 15, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 4125**—To make improvements in the operation and administration of the Federal courts, and for other purposes. “Federal Courts Improvement Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, October 1, 2002 (370 yeas; 21 nays).
- H.R. 4167**—To extend for 8 additional months the period for which chapter 12 of title 11 of the United States Code is reenacted. Passed the House April 16, 2002 (407 yeas; 3 nays). (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 4477**—To amend title 18, United States Code, with respect to crimes involving the transportation of persons and sex tourism. “Sex Tourism Prohibition Improvement Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, June 26, 2002 (418 yeas; 8 nays).
- H.R. 4546**—To authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2003 for military activities of the Department of Defense, for military construction, and for defense activities of the Department of Energy, to prescribe personnel strengths, for such fiscal year for the Armed Forces, and for other purposes. “National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2003”. Passed the House, amended, May 10 (legislative day May 9), 2002 (359 yeas; 58 nays). (*Committee named to conference*).
- H.R. 4558**—To extend the Irish Peace Process Cultural and Training Program. Passed the House July 22, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 4561**—To amend title 5, United States Code, to require that agencies, in promulgating rules, take into consideration the impact of such rules on the privacy of individuals, and for other purposes. “Federal Agency Protection of Privacy Act”. Passed the House October 7, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 4598**—To provide for the sharing of homeland security information by Federal intelligence and law enforcement agencies with State and local entities. “Homeland Security Information Sharing Act”. Passed the House, amended, June 26, 2002 (422 yeas; 2 nays).
- H.R. 4600**—To improve patient access to health care services and provide improved medical care by reducing the excessive burden the liability system places on the health care delivery system. “Help Efficient, Accessible, Low Cost, Timely Health Care (HEALTH) Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, September 26, 2002 (217 yeas; 203 nays).

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- H.R. 4623**—To prevent trafficking in child pornography and obscenity, to proscribe pandering and solicitation relating to visual depictions of minors engaging in sexually explicit conduct, to prevent the use of child pornography and obscenity to facilitate crimes against children, and for other purposes. “Child Obscenity and Pornography Prevention Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, June 25, 2002 (413 yeas; 8 nays; 1 “present”).
- H.R. 4635**—To amend title 49, United States Code, to establish a program for Federal flight deck officers, and for other purposes. “Arming Pilots Against Terrorism Act”. Passed the House, amended, July 10, 2002 (310 yeas; 113 nays). (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 4679**—To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide a maximum term of supervised release of life for child sex offenders. “Lifetime Consequences for Sex Offenders Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, June 25, 2002 (409 yeas; 3 nays).
- H.R. 4757**—To improve the national instant criminal background check system, and for other purposes. “Our Lady of Peace Act”. Passed the House, amended, October 15, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 4858**—To improve access to physicians in medically underserved areas. Passed the House June 25, 2002 (407 yeas; 7 nays).
- H.R. 4965**—To prohibit the procedure commonly known as partial-birth abortion. “Partial-Birth Abortion Ban Act of 2002”. Passed the House July 24, 2002 (274 yeas; 151 noes; 1 “present”).
- H.R. 4967**—To establish new nonimmigrant classes for border commuter students. “Border Commuter Student Act of 2002”. Passed the House October 15, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 5005**—To establish the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes. “Homeland Security Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, July 26, 2002 (252 yeas; 132 noes). (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 5017**—To amend the Temporary Emergency Wildfire Suppression Act to facilitate the ability of the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture to enter into reciprocal agreements with foreign countries for the sharing of personnel to fight wildfires. Passed the House July 9, 2002, by voice vote. (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 5118**—To provide for enhanced penalties for accounting and auditing improprieties at publicly traded companies, and for other purposes. “Corporate Fraud Accountability Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, July 16, 2002 (391 yeas; 28 nays). (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 5334**—To ensure that a public safety officer who suffers a fatal heart attack or stroke while on duty shall be presumed to have died in the line of duty for purposes of public safety officer survivor benefits. “Hometown Heroes Survivors Benefits Act of 2002”. Passed the House November 15, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.R. 5422**—To prevent child abduction, and for other purposes. “Child Abduction Prevention Act”. Passed the House, amended, October 8, 2002 (390 yeas; 24 nays).
- H.R. 5469**—To suspend for a period of 6 months the determination of the Librarian of Congress of July 8, 2002, relating to rates and terms for the digital performance of sound recordings and ephemeral recordings. Passed the House, amended, October 7, 2002, by voice vote. (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 5472**—To extend for 6 months the period for which chapter 12 of title 11 of the United States Code is reenacted. Passed the House October 1, 2002, by voice vote. (*Committee discharged*).
- H.R. 5710**—To establish the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes. “Homeland Security Act of 2002”. Passed the House, amended, November 13, 2002 (299 yeas; 132 nays). (*Passed the House as alternative to H.R. 5005*).
- H.J.Res. 36**—Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States authorizing the Congress to prohibit desecration of the flag of the United States. Agreed to by the House July 17, 2001 (298 yeas; 125 nays).
- H.J.Res. 42**—Memorializing fallen firefighters by lowering the American flag to half-staff in honor of the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service in Emmitsburg, Maryland. Passed the House, amended, October 2, 2001 (420 yeas; 0 nays).
- H.Con.Res. 225**—Expressing the sense of the Congress that, as a symbol of the solidarity following the terrorist attacks on the United States on September 11, 2001, every United States citizen is encouraged to display the flag of the United States. Agreed to by the House September 13, 2001, by voice vote. (*Committee discharged*).

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- H.Con.Res. 227**—Condemning bigotry and violence against Arab-Americans, American Muslims, and Americans from South Asia in the wake of terrorist attacks in New York City, New York, and Washington, D.C., on September 11, 2001. Agreed to by the House September 15 (legislative day September 14), 2001, by voice vote. (*Committee discharged*).
- H.Con.Res. 243**—Expressing the sense of the Coongress that the Public Safety Officer Medal of Valor should be presented to the public safety officers who have perished and select other public safety officers who deserve special recognition for outstanding valor above and beyond the call of duty in the aftermath of the terrorist attacks in the United States on September 11, 2001. Agreed to by the House October 30, 2001 (409 yeas; 0 nays). (*Committee discharged*).
- H.Con.Res. 311**—Recognizing the Civil Air Patrol for 60 years of service to the United States. Agreed to by the House February 28, 2002, by voice vote. (*Committee discharged*).
- H.Res. 193**—Requesting that the President focus appropriate attention on the issues of neighborhood crime prevention, community policing, and reduction of school crime by delivering speeches, convening meetings, and directing his Administration to make reducing crime an important priority, and for other purposes. Agreed to by the House August 2, 2001, by voice vote.
- H.Res. 224**—Honoring the New Jersey State Law Enforcement Officers Association. Agreed to by the House November 1, 2001, by voice vote. (*Committee discharged*).
- H.Res. 417**—Recognizing and honoring the career and work of Justice C. Clifton Young. Agreed to by the House October 1, 2002, by voice vote.
- H.Res. 459**—Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that *Newdow v. U.S. Congress* was erroneously decided, and for other purposes. Agreed to by the House June 27, 2002 (416 yeas; 3 nays; 11 “present”). (*Committee discharged*).
- S. 320**—To make technical corrections in patent, copyright, and trademark laws. “Intellectual Property and High Technology Technical Amendments Act of 2001”. Passed the House, amended, March 14, 2001, by voice vote.
- S. 1202**—To amend the Ethics in Government Act of 1978 (5 U.S.C. App.) to extend the authorization of appropriations for the Office of Government Ethics through fiscal year 2006. Passed the House December 19, 2001, by voice vote. (*Committee discharged*).
- S. 1339**—To amend the Bring Them Home Alive Act of 200 to provide an asylum program with regard to American Persian Gulf War POW/MIAs, and for other purposes. “Persian Gulf War POW/MIA Accountability Act of 2002”. Passed the House October 15, 2002, by voice vote.
- S. 1424**—To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to provide permanent authority for the admission of “S” visa non-immigrants. Passed the House September 15 (legislative day September 14), 2001, by voice vote. (*Held at the desk*).
- S. 1438**—To authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2002 for military activities of the Department of Defense, for military construction, and for defense activities of the Department of Energy, to prescribe personnel strengths, for such fiscal year for the Armed Forces, and for other purposes. “National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2002”. Passed the House, amended, October 17, 2001, by voice vote. (*Committee named to conference*).
- S. 1888**—To amend title 18 of the United States Code to correct a technical error in the codification of title 36 of the United States Code. Passed the House February 6, 2002 (413 yeas; 0 nays). (*Committee discharged*).
- S. 2431**—To amend the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to ensure that chaplains killed in the line of duty receive public safety officer death benefits. “Mychal Judge Police and Fire Chaplains Public Safety Officers’ Benefit Act of 2002”. Passed the House June 11, 2002, by voice vote. (*Held at the desk; passed in lieu of H.R. 3297 above*).
- S. 2690**—To reaffirm the reference to one Nation under God in the Pledge of Allegiance. Passed the House, amended, October 8, 2002 (401 yeas; 5 nays; 4 “present”).
- S.J.Res. 13**—Conferring honorary citizenship of the United States on Marie Joseph Paul Yves Roche Gilbert du Motier, also known as the Marquis de Lafayette. Passed the House, amended, July 22, 2002, by voice vote.
