

## CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS AND SIMPLE RESOLUTIONS APPROVED

### PUBLIC LEGISLATION

- H.Con.Res. 225**—Expressing the sense of the Congress that, as a symbol of the solidarity following the terrorist attacks on the United States on September 11, 2001, every United States citizen is encouraged to display the flag of the United States. Agreed to by the House September 13, 2001; agreed to by the Senate September 13, 2001.
- H.Con.Res. 227**—Condemning bigotry and violence against Arab-Americans, American Muslims, and Americans from South Asia in the wake of terrorist attacks in New York City, New York, and Washington, D.C., on September 11, 2001. Agreed to by the House September 15 (legislative day September 14), 2001; agreed to by the Senate September 26, 2001.
- H.Con.Res. 243**—Expressing the sense of the Congress that the Public Safety Officer Medal of Valor should be presented to the public safety officers who have perished and select other public safety officers who deserve special recognition for outstanding valor above and beyond the call of duty in the aftermath of the terrorist attacks in the United States on September 11, 2001. Agreed to by the House October 30, 2001; agreed to by the Senate April 18, 2002.
- H.Res. 193**—Requesting that the President focus appropriate attention on the issues of neighborhood crime prevention, community policing, and reduction of school crime by delivering speeches, convening meetings, and directing his Administration to make reducing crime an important priority, and for other purposes. Agreed to by the House August 2, 2001.
- H.Res. 224**—Honoring the New Jersey State Law Enforcement Officers Association. Agreed to by the House November 1, 2001.
- H.Res. 417**—Recognizing and honoring the career and work of Justice C. Clifton Young. Agreed to by the House October 1, 2002.
- H.Res. 459**—Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that *Newdow v. U.S. Congress* was erroneously decided, and for other purposes. Agreed to by the House June 27, 2002.

### PRIVATE LEGISLATION

- H.Res. 103**—Referring the bill (H.R. 1258), entitled “A bill for the relief of Sarabeth M. Davis, Robert S. Borders, Victor Maron, Irving Berke, and Adele E. Conrad”, to the chief judge of the United States Court of Federal Claims for a report thereon. Agreed to by the House May 21, 2002.
