

## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

Apr. 24, 2001

MR. WARNER, FOR HIMSELF, MR. ALLEN, MR. KERRY, MR. BREAUX, MR. HELMS, MR. SESSIONS, MR. ROBERTS, MR. JEFFORDS, MR. INHOFE, MR. REID, AND MR. LEAHY

Conferring honorary citizenship of the United States on Paul Yves Roch Gilbert du Motier, also known as the Marquis de Lafayette.

Apr. 24, 2001—Referred to the Senate Committee on the Judiciary.

Dec. 13, 2001—Reported favorably to the Senate by Mr. Leahy. (No written report).

Dec. 18, 2001—Passed the Senate. (Unanimous consent).

Dec. 19, 2001—Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.

Mar. 18, 2002—Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Claims.

Apr. 17, 2002—Subcommittee mark-up. Ordered favorably reported to the Full Committee without amendment. (Voice vote).

July 17, 2002—Full Committee mark-up. Ordered favorably reported to the House, amended. (Voice vote).

July 19, 2002—Reported favorably to the House, amended, by Mr. Sensenbrenner. (H.Rept. 107-595) (Union Calendar).

July 22, 2002—Passed the House, as amended, under suspension of the rules, two-thirds affirmative vote required. (Voice vote). (Amended the title to read “Conferring honorary citizenship of the United States posthumously on Marie Joseph Paul Yves Roche Gilbert du Motier, the Marquis de Lafayette”).

July 24, 2002—The Senate agreed to the House amendments. (Unanimous consent).

July 26, 2002—Presented to the President.

Aug. 6, 2002—Approved by the President. Public Law 107-209.
