To enhance energy conservation, research and development and to provide for security and diversity in the energy supply for the American people, and for other purposes.

Aug. 1, 2001. H.Res. 216, providing 1 hour and 30 minutes of general debate, waives all points of order against consideration; provides that the amendment printed in the Rules Committee report shall be con-

sidered as adopted, and makes in order only those amendments printed in the Rules committee report, reported to the House. H.Rept. 107-178.

Aug. 1, 2001. H.Res. 216 passed House, amended, by a vote of 240 yeas, 189 nays.

Aug. 2, 2001. Motion to recommit with instructions failed by a vote of 206 yeas, 223 nays.

Aug. 2, 2001. Passed House by a vote of 240 yeas, 189 nays.

Apr. 25, 2002. Passed the Senate, after striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the text of S. 517, as amended, by a vote of 88 yeas, 11 nays.

Apr. 25, 2002. Senate insisted on its amendment and requested a conference with the House.

The instructions contained in the motion require the managers on the part of the House to ensure, to the extent possible within the scope of the conference, that no provision of the bill will create a deficit in the non-social security portion of the Federal budget during any year of the 10-year budget estimating period unless there are sufficient offsets under the bill so that there is no net deficit during such 10-year period.
