A BILL

To revive and extend through December 31, 1996, a temporary reduction of duty on certain disposable surgical gowns and drapes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF REDUCTION OF DUTY ON CER-**
4 **TAIN DISPOSABLE SURGICAL GOWNS AND**
5 **DRAPES.**

6 Heading 9902.62.10 of the Harmonized Tariff
7 Schedule of the United States is amended by striking out
8 “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/96”.

1 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsection
3 (b), the amendment made by section 1 applies with respect
4 to goods entered, or withdrawn from warehouse for con-
5 sumption, on or after the 15th day after the date of the
6 enactment of this Act.

7 (b) RETROACTIVE PROVISION.—Notwithstanding sec-
8 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision
9 of law to the contrary, upon a request filed with the appro-
10 priate customs officer before the 180th day after the date
11 of the enactment of this Act, any entry or withdrawal from
12 warehouse for consumption of goods to which the amend-
13 ment made by section 1 applies and that was made—

14 (1) after December 31, 1992; and

15 (2) before the 15th day after the date of the en-
16 actment of this Act;

17 and with respect to which there would have been a lower
18 duty if the amendment made by section 1 had applied to
19 such entry or withdrawal, shall be liquidated or
20 reliquidated as though such entry or withdrawal had oc-
21 curred on such 15th day.
