- 20 SEC. 201. EMERGENCY TRANSPORTATION PRIORITIES.
- 21 (a) List.—The Secretary of Transportation, in con-
- 22 sultation with a representative sample of State and local
- 23 government transportation officials, shall compile a
- 24 prioritized list of emergency transportation projects, which

will guide the allocation of funding to the States from the Emergency Transportation Safety Fund. 3 (b) Criteria.—In compiling the list under subsection (a), the Secretary of Transportation, in addition 5 to other criteria established by the Secretary, shall rank priorities in descending order, beginning with— 6 7 (1) whether the project is part of the interstate 8 highway system; 9 (2) whether the project is a road or bridge that 10 is closed for safety reasons; 11 (3) the impact of the project on interstate com-12 merce; 13 (4) the volume of traffic affected by the project; 14 and 15 (5) the overall value of the project or entity. 16 (c) Report.—Not later than 120 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Transpor-18 tation shall submit a report to Congress that includes— 19 (1) a prioritized list of emergency transpor-20 tation projects to be funded through the Emergency 21 Transportation Safety Fund; and 22 (2) a description of the criteria used to estab-23 lish the list referred to in paragraph (1). 24 (d) QUARTERLY UPDATES.—Not less frequently than

4 times per year, the Secretary of Transportation shall—

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1	(1) update the report submitted pursuant to
2	subsection (c);
3	(2) send a copy of the report to Congress; and
4	(3) make a copy of the report available to the
5	public through the Department of Transportation's
6	Web site.

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
