# <sup>112TH CONGRESS</sup> 2D SESSION H.R.4228

To direct the Secretary of State to designate Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps Qods Force as a foreign terrorist organization, and for other purposes.

## A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of State to designate Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps Qods Force as a foreign terrorist organization, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### **3** SECTION 1. FINDINGS.

- 4 Congress finds the following:
- 5 (1) On January 19, 1984, the Secretary of
  6 State determined that the Islamic Republic of Iran
  7 is a state sponsor of terrorism.

(2) The Qods Force is the elite external oper ations branch of the Iran's Islamic Revolutionary
 Guard Corps and the Iranian regime's primary
 mechanism for cultivating and supporting terrorists
 abroad.

6 (3) The Qods Force provides aid in the form of
7 weapons, training, and funding to Hamas and other
8 Palestinian terrorist groups, Lebanese Hizballah,
9 Iraq-based militants, and Taliban fighters in Af10 ghanistan.

11 (4) The Qods Force is behind some of the dead-12 liest terrorist attacks of the past three decades, in-13 cluding the 1983 and 1984 bombings of the United 14 States Embassy and annex in Beirut, the 1983 15 bombing of the Marine barracks in Beirut, the 1992 16 bombing of the Israeli embassy in Buenos Aires, 17 1994 attack on the AMIA Jewish Community Cen-18 ter in Buenos Aires, and the 1996 Khobar Towers 19 bombing in Saudi Arabia.

(5) In 2007, President George W. Bush and
General David Petraeus, the top U.S. commander in
Iraq, accused Iran's Qods Force of aiding militias in
killing American soldiers in Iraq.

24 (6) In 2007, the U.S. Department of the Treas25 ury designated the Qods Force for providing mate-

rial support to the Taliban and other terrorist orga nizations.

3 (7) On October 25, 2007, Iran's Islamic Revo4 lutionary Guard Corps Qods Force was sanctioned
5 under Executive Order 13382, for supporting pro6 liferation of weapons of mass destruction.

7 (8) Section 1258 of the National Defense Au-8 thorization Act for Fiscal Year 2008 expressed the 9 sense of Congress that "the United States should 10 designate Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guards Corps 11 as a foreign terrorist organization under section 219 12 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 13 1189) and place the Islamic Revolutionary Guards 14 Corps on the list of Specially Designated Global Ter-15 rorists, as established under the International Emer-16 gency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 et 17 seq.) and initiated under Executive Order 13224 18 (September 23, 2001)".

(9) In the period following the June 2009 presidential election in Iran, the Qods Force was implicated in custodial deaths and the killings of election
protesters and committed other acts of politically
motivated violence, including torture, beatings, and
rape.

(10) On April 29, 2011, President Obama 1 2 issued Executive Order 13572, Blocking Property of 3 Certain Persons With Respect to Human Rights Abuses in Syria, including the Qods Force, for the 4 5 repression of the people of Syria, manifested most 6 recently by the use of violence and torture against, 7 and arbitrary arrests and detentions of, peaceful 8 protestors by police, security forces, and other enti-9 ties that have engaged in human rights abuses, 10 which constitute an unusual and extraordinary 11 threat to the national security, foreign policy, and 12 economy of the United States.

13 (11) On October 11, 2011, the U.S. Depart-14 ment of Justice announced that two members of 15 Iran's Qods Force were charged in an alleged plot 16 to assassinate the Saudi Arabian Ambassador to the 17 Unites States. The criminal complaint against them 18 included charges of conspiracy to murder a foreign 19 official; conspiracy to engage in foreign travel and 20 use of interstate and foreign commerce facilities in 21 the commission of murder-for-hire; conspiracy to use 22 a weapon of mass destruction (explosives); and con-23 spiracy to commit an act of international terrorism 24 transcending national boundaries.

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2 of the Treasury designated Iran's Qods Force Gen-3 eral Gholamreza Baghbani as a Specially Designated 4 Narcotics Trafficker for the role that the Qods 5 Force played in its scheme to support terrorism. 6 (13) Iran's Qods Force stations operatives in 7 foreign embassies, charities, and religious and cul-8 tural institutions to foster relationships, often build-9 ing on existing socio-economic ties with the well-es-10 tablished Shia Diaspora, and recent years have wit-11 nessed an increased presence in Latin America. 12 SEC. 2. DESIGNATION OF IRAN'S ISLAMIC REVOLUTIONARY 13 **GUARD CORPS QODS FORCE AS A FOREIGN** 14 TERRORIST ORGANIZATION.

The Secretary of State shall designate Iran's Islamic
Revolutionary Guard Corps Qods Force as a foreign terrorist organization under section 219 of the Immigration
and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1189).

### **19 SEC. 3. REPORT.**

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The Secretary of State shall submit to the Committee
on Foreign Affairs of the House of Representatives and
the Committee on Foreign Relations of the Senate a report on terrorist activities of Iran's Islamic Revolutionary
Guard Corps Qods Force.
