Powner, Director, Information Technology Management Issues, Government Accountability Office; Mark A. Rothstein, University of Louisville School of Medicine Institute for Bioethics, Health Policy and Law, Louisville, Kentucky; and Carol C. Diamond, Markle Foundation, New York, New York.
