Enforcement Authority Act; (3) H.R. 320—CJ's Home Protection Act; (4) H. Con. Res. 197—Encouraging banks and mortgage servicers to work with families affected by contaminated drywall to allow temporary forbearance without penalty on payments on their home mortgages; (5) H. Res. 494—Recognizing the exemplary service of the soldiers of the 30th Infantry Division (Old Hickory) of the United States Army during World War II; (6) H. Con. Res. 129—Congratulating the Sailors of the United States Submarine Force upon the completion of 1,000 Ohio-class ballistic missile submarine (SSBN) deterrent patrols; (7) H. Res. 861—Supporting the goals and ideals of National Military Family Month; (8) H.R. 3980—Redundancy Elimination and Enhanced Performance for Preparedness Grants Act; (9) H. Res. 28—Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that the Transportation Security Administration should, in accordance with the congressional mandate provided for in the Implementing Recommendations of the 9/11 Commission Act of 2007, enhance security against terrorist attack and other security threats to our Nation's rail and mass transit lines; and (10) H.R. 3963—Criminal Investigative Training Restoration Act.
