The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 801, by a record vote of 6 to 2, reports the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for the consideration of House Joint Resolution 106, Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to marriage, under a closed rule. The rule provides 2 hours and 30 minutes of debate in the House equally divided and controlled by the Majority Leader and the Minority Leader or their designees. The rule provides one motion to recommit.

Finally, Section 2 of the resolution provides that during consideration of the bill, notwithstanding the operation of the previous question, the Chair may postpone further consideration of the bill to a time designated by the Speaker.
