¶67.20 PROVIDING FOR THE  
CONSIDERATION OF H.R. 5260

Mr. DERRICK, by direction of the Committee on Rules, called up the following resolution (H. Res. 475):

*Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of the Whole House on the State of the Union for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 5260) to extend the emergency unemployment compensation program, to revise the trigger provisions contained in the extended unemployment compensation program, and for other purposes, and the first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against the bill, as amended, and against its consideration are hereby waived. After general debate, which shall be confined to the bill and which shall not exceed one hour, to be equally divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee on Ways and Means, the bill shall be considered as having been read for amendment under the five-minute rule. The amendment printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution shall be considered as having been adopted in the House and in the Committee of the Whole. No amendment to the bill shall be in order. At the conclusion of the consideration of the bill for amendment, the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House, and the previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill to final passage without intervening motion except one motion to recommit.
