¶67.23 UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION EXTENSION

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. MFUME, pursuant to House Resolution 475 and rule XXIII, declared the House resolved into the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 5260) to extend the emergency unemployment compensation program, to revise the trigger provisions contained in the extended unemployment compensation program, and for other purposes.

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. MFUME, by unanimous consent, designated Mr. LEWIS of Georgia as Chairman of the Committee of the Whole; and after some time spent therein,

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. GEPHARDT, assumed the Chair.

When Mr. LEWIS of Georgia, Chairman, pursuant to House Resolution 475, reported the bill back to the House.

The previous question having been ordered by said resolution.

Pursuant to House Resolution 475, the amendment printed in the report to accompany said resolution was considered as adopted.

The bill was ordered to be engrossed and read a third time, was read a third time by title.

Mr. ARCHER moved to recommit the bill to the Committee on Ways and Means with instructions to promptly report the bill back to the House forthwith with extended unemployment benefits through March of 1993 which are offset in a manner which is consistent with the current budget rules and does not increase the deficits for the fiscal years 1992 through 1995.

After debate, By unanimous consent, the previous question was ordered on the motion to recommit with instructions.

The question being put, *viva voce*, Will the House recommit said bill with instructions?

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. GEPHARDT, announced that the yeas had it.

Mr. ARCHER objected to the vote on the ground that a quorum was not present and not voting.

A quorum not being present, The roll was called under clause 4, rule XV, and the call was taken by electronic device.
