74.6 MILITARY CONSTRUCTION APPROPRIATIONS

Mr. HEFNER moved that the House resolve itself into the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 2446) making appropriations for military construction for the Department of Defense for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994, and for other purposes.

Pending said motion,

On motion of Mr. HEFNER, by unanimous consent,

Ordered, That time for general debate continue not to exceed one hour to be equally divided and controlled by Mr. HEFNER and Mrs. VUCANOVICH.

The question being put, viva voce,

Will the House agree to said motion?

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. MONTGOMERY, announced that the yeas had it.

So the motion was agreed to.

Accordingly,

The House resolved itself into the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for the consideration of said bill.

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. MONTGOMERY, by unanimous consent, designated Mr. CARDIN as Chairman of the Committee of the Whole.

The Acting Chairman, Mr. HALL of Ohio assumed the Chair; and after some time spent therein,

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. MONTGOMERY, assumed the Chair.

When Mr. CARDIN, Chairman, reported that the Committee, having had under consideration said bill, had directed him to report the same back to the House with an amendment adopted by the Committee with the recommendation that the amendment be agreed to and that the bill, as amended, do pass.

The following amendment, reported from the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union, was agreed to:

At the end of the bill, add the following new sections:

SEC. . COMPLIANCE WITH BUY AMERICAN ACT.

No funds appropriated pursuant to this Act may be expended by an entity unless the entity agrees that in expending the assistance the entity will comply with sections 2 through 4 of the Act of March 3, 1933 (41 U.S.C. 10a-10c, popularly known as the "Buy American Act").

SEC. . SENSE OF CONGRESS; REQUIREMENT REGARDING NOTICE.

(a) PURCHASE OF AMERICAN-MADE EQUIPMENT AND PRODUCTS.—In the case of any equipment or products that may be authorized to be purchased with financial assistance provided under this Act, it is the sense of the Congress that entities receiving such assistance should, in expending the assistance, purchase only American-made equipment and products.

(b) NOTICE TO RECIPIENTS OF ASSISTANCE.—In providing financial assistance under this Act, the Secretary of Treasury shall provide to each recipient of the assistance a notice describing the statement made in subsection (a) by the Congress.

SEC. . PROHIBITION OF CONTRACTS.

If it has been finally determined by a court or Federal agency that any person intentionally affixed a fraudulent label bearing a "Made in America" inscription, or any inscription with the same meaning, to any product sold in or shipped to the United States that was not made in the United States, such person shall be ineligible to receive any contract or subcontract made with funds provided pursuant to this Act, pursuant to the debarment, suspension, and ineligibility procedures described in section 9.400 through 9.409 of title 48, Code of Federal Regulations.

The bill, as amended, was ordered to be engrossed and read a third time, was read a third time by title.
