A message from the Senate by Mr. Hallen, one of its clerks, announced that the Senate had passed with amendments in which the concurrence

of the House is requested, bills of the House of the following titles:

H.R. 1134. An Act to provide for the transfer of certain public lands located in Clear Creek County, Colorado, to the United States Forest Service, the State of Colorado, and certain local governments in the State of Colorado, and for other purposes.

H.R. 2947. An Act to amend the Commemorative Works Act, and for other purposes.
