SEC. 339. The amount otherwise provided by this Act for "DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION—OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY—Salaries and Expenses" is hereby increased by \$26,300,000, of which amount \$8,300,000 shall be derived from amounts provided for in this Act under the heading "INTERSTATE COMMERCE COMMISSION—Salaries and Expenses".

Page 50, strike lines 8 through 10.

Page 57, after line 7, insert the following new section:

SEC. 339. (a) PURCHASE OF AMERICAN-MADE EQUIPMENT AND PRODUCTS.—It is the sense of the Congress that, to the greatest extent practicable, all equipment and products purchased with funds made available in this Act should be American-made.

(b) NOTICE REQUIREMENT.—In providing financial assistance to, or entering into any contract with, any entity using funds made available in this Act, the head of each Federal agency, to the greatest extent practicable, shall provide to such entity a notice describing the statement made in subsection (a) by the Congress.

The bill, as amended, was ordered to be engrossed and read a third time, was read a third time by title.

¶64.17 MOTION TO INSTRUCT CONFEREES—H.R. 3355

Mr. MCCOLLUM submitted the privileged motion to instruct the managers on the part of the House at the conference with the Senate on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses on the bill (H.R. 3355) to amend the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to allow grants to increase police presence, to expand and improve cooperative efforts between law enforcement agencies and members of the community to address crime and disorder problems, and otherwise to enhance public safety, be instructed not to agree to title IX, relating to racially discriminatory sentencing, of the House amendment or to any similar provision.
