XX, the bill (H.R. 3103) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to improve portability and continuity of health insurance coverage in the group and individual markets, to combat waste, fraud, and abuse in health insurance and health care delivery, to promote the use of medical savings accounts, to improve access to long-term care services and coverage, to simplify the administration of health insurance, and for other purposes; together with the amendment of the Senate thereto, was taken from the Speaker's table.

¶72.13 MOTION TO INSTRUCT CONFEREES—H.R. 3103

Mr. DINGELL moved that the managers on the part of the House at the conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses on the Senate amendment to the H.R. 3103, be instructed to recede to the Senate amendment except with respect to section 305 of the Senate amendment; and with respect to such section (A) to consider whether the enactment of such section would result in an increase in premiums for private health plans and, if so, (B) to provide for concurring with such section with an amendment that adjusts such section to provide for the maximum coverage of mental health services under health plans without increasing such premiums.
