The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. SNOWBARGER, pursuant to clause 5, rule I, announced that further proceedings on the motion were postponed.

12.8 SAM NUNN FEDERAL CENTER

Mr. KIM moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill (H.R. 613) to designate the Federal building located at 100 Alabama Street, NW in Atlanta, Georgia, as the "Sam Nunn Federal Center"; as amended.

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. SNOWBARGER, recognized Mr. KIM and Mr. TRAFICANT, each for 20 minutes.

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. SNOWBARGER, announced that two-thirds of the Members present had voted in the affirmative.

So, two-thirds of the Members present having voted in favor thereof, the rules were suspended and said bill, as amended, was passed.

By unanimous consent, the title was amended so as to read: "An Act to designate the Federal building located at 61 Forsyth Street SW., in Atlanta, Georgia, as the 'Sam Nunn Atlanta Federal Center.'"

A motion to reconsider the votes whereby the rules were suspended and said bill, as amended, was passed and the title was amended was, by unanimous consent, laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. KIM, by unanimous consent, the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure was discharged from further consideration of the bill of Senate (S. 347) to designate the Federal building located at 100 Alabama Street NW, in Atlanta, Georgia, as the "Sam Nunn Federal Center".

When said bill was considered and read twice.

Mr. KIM submitted the following amendment, which was agreed to:

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert the provisions of H.R. 613, as passed by the House.

The bill, as amended, was ordered to be read a third time, was read a third time by title, and passed.

By unanimous consent, the title was amended so as to read: "An Act to designate the Federal building located at 61 Forsyth Street SW., in Atlanta, Georgia, as the 'Sam Nunn Atlanta Federal Center.'"

A motion to reconsider the votes whereby said bill, as amended, was passed and the title was amended was, by unanimous consent, laid on the table.

Ordered, That the Clerk request the concurrence of the Senate in said amendments.

By unanimous consent, H.R. 613, a similar House bill, was laid on the table.

McKinney Homeless Assistance Act to consolidate the Federal programs for housing assistance for the homeless into a block grant program that ensures that States and communities are provided sufficient flexibility to use assistance amounts effectively; as amended.
