¶50.16 FURTHER MESSAGE FROM THE  
SENATE

A further message from the Senate  
by Mr. Lundregan, one of its clerks, an-  
nounced that the Senate had passed  
with amendments in which the concur-  
rence of the House is requested, a bill  
of the House of the following title:

H.R. 2709. An Act to impose certain sanc-  
tions on foreign persons who transfer items  
contributing to Iran's efforts to acquire, de-

velop, or produce ballistic missiles, and to  
implement the obligations of the United  
States under the Chemical Weapons Conven-  
tion.

¶50.18 WAIVING POINTS OF ORDER  
AGAINST THE CONFERENCE REPORT TO

¶50.19 WAIVING A REQUIREMENT OF  
CLAUSE 4(B) OF RULE XI

Resolved, That the requirement of clause  
4(b) of rule XI for a two-thirds vote to con-  
sider a report from the Committee on Rules  
on the same day it is presented to the House  
is waived with respect to any resolution re-  
ported from that committee on the legisla-  
tive day of May 22, 1998, providing for con-  
sideration or disposition of the bill (H.R. 2400)  
to authorize funds for Federal-aid highways,  
highway safety programs, and transit pro-  
grams, and for other purposes, an amend-  
ment thereto, a conference report thereon,  
or an amendment reported in disagreement  
from a conference thereon.

When said resolution was considered.

¶50.20 WAIVING POINTS OF ORDER  
AGAINST THE CONFERENCE REPORT ON  
H.R. 2400

Mr. MCINNIS, by direction of the  
Committee on Rules, called up the fol-  
lowing resolution (H. Res. 449):

Resolved, That upon adoption of this reso-  
lution it shall be in order to consider the  
conference report to accompany the bill  
(H.R. 2400) to authorize funds for Federal-aid  
highways, highway safety programs, and
