50.22 PROVIDING FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF H.R. 3433

Mr. MCINNIS, by direction of the Committee on Rules, reported (Rept. No. 105-553) the resolution (H. Res. 450) providing for consideration of the bill

(H.R. 3433) to amend the Social Security Act to establish a Ticket to Work and Self-Sufficiency Program in the Social Security Administration to provide beneficiaries with disabilities meaningful opportunities to return to work and to extend Medicare coverage for such beneficiaries, and to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide a tax credit for impairment-related work expenses.

50.23 BUILDING EFFICIENT SURFACE TRANSPORTATION AND EQUITY

Mr. SHUSTER, pursuant to House Resolution 449, called up the following conference report (Rept. No. 105-550):

The committee of conference on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses on the amendment of the Senate to the bill (H.R. 2400), to authorize funds for Federal-aid highways, highway safety programs, and transit programs, and for other purposes, having met, after full and free conference, have agreed to recommend and do recommend to their respective Houses as follows:
