TITLE I—LEVELS AND AMOUNTS

SECTION 101. CONCURRENT RESOLUTION ON THE BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 1999.

The Congress declares that this is the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 1999 and that the appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal years 2000 through 2003 are hereby set forth.

SEC. 102. RECOMMENDED LEVELS AND AMOUNTS.

The following budgetary levels are appropriate for the fiscal years 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, and 2003:

(1) FEDERAL REVENUES.—For purposes of the enforcement of this resolution:

(A) The recommended levels of Federal revenues are as follows:

- Fiscal year 1999: \$1,304,000,000,000.
- Fiscal year 2000: \$1,314,300,000,000.
- Fiscal year 2001: \$1,348,100,000,000.
- Fiscal year 2002: \$1,399,900,000,000.
- Fiscal year 2003: \$1,452,300,000,000.

(B) The amounts by which the aggregate levels of Federal revenues should be changed are as follows:

- Fiscal year 1999: —\$18,000,000,000.
- Fiscal year 2000: —\$27,000,000,000.
- Fiscal year 2001: —\$31,000,000,000.
- Fiscal year 2002: —\$36,000,000,000.
- Fiscal year 2003: —\$38,000,000,000.

(2) NEW BUDGET AUTHORITY.—For purposes of the enforcement of this resolution, the appropriate levels of total new budget authority are as follows:
