CHAP. 2936.—An Act To amend an Act entitled "An Act to authorize the Ox Bow Power Company of South Dakota to construct a dam across the Missouri River.'

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That section two of chapter Missouri River, eighteen hundred and twenty-one of the laws of eighteen hundred and Time extended to ox Bow Power Com-ninety-four, approved April twenty-eighth, nineteen hundred and four, pany to dam. is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 2. That this Act shall be null and void unless the structures the structure the even and completed within one year and completed within amended." within three years from the date of approval thereof.'

CHAP. 2937.-An Act To provide for the establishment of an immigration station at Charleston, in the State of South Carolina, and the erection in said city, on a site to be selected for said station, of a public building.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of the Department of Commerce and Labor be, and he is hereby, authorized for and directed to establish an immigration station at the city of Charleston, in the State of South Carolina, and to cause to be erected, on a site to be selected, a public building to temporarily accommodate and care for immigrants arriving at said city: *Provided*, That the land and dock room necessary for said station and building be transferred to the free of cost.

SEC. 2. That the sum of seventy thousand dollars is hereby appro- Appropriation from immigrant fund. priated for the erection of said building, which sum shall be paid from the immigrant fund, said sum to include heating and ventilating apparatus, elevators, and approaches.

CHAP. 2938.—An Act To authorize the Secretary of War to loan and deliver certain brass field pieces to the Valley Forge Park Commission of the State of Pennsylvania.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representation of War Paley Forge Park, States of America in Congress assembled, That the Secretary of War Paley Forge Cannon, etc., loaned Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United be, and he is hereby, authorized to loan and deliver to the Valley Forge to Park Commission, for the ornamentation of the grounds of Valley Forge Park, of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, twenty-five brass field pieces, with their carriages and equipments, now in the possession of the United States, the same to be subject at all times to the order of the Secretary of War: Provided, That no expense shall be incurred by the United States for the delivery of said articles.

CHAP. 2939.—An Act To promote the safety of employees and travelers upon railroads by limiting the hours of service of employees thereon.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the provisions of this Act shall apply to any common carrier or carriers, their officers, employees restricted. agents, and employees, engaged in the transportation of passengers
