NATION'S PRINTER TO ENGAGE NEW YORK TECHNOLOGY CROWD ON DIGITAL REVOLUTION

WHO: The Public Printer of the United States, Bruce James, returns to his alma mater, Rochester Institute of Technology, to address the National Government Publishers Association about the digital transformation of Government documents. Printers from around the country will attend one of the last major addresses to be given by the Public Printer. James is a 1964 graduate of R.I.T.'s School of Printing Management and Sciences. James is chairman emeritus and a trustee at R.I.T.

WHAT: James began a major transformation of the U.S. Government Printing Office when he was appointed by President George W. Bush and confirmed by the U.S. Senate in 2002. Under his leadership, GPO developed a Future Digital System (FDsys) to give the American public a one stop site to authentic published government information. Bruce will also address the operation underway at GPO to develop electronic passports for the State Department. As GPO moves into the Digital Age, Bruce will discuss another big component of future plans, a new site for the agency's headquarters.
