Mr. FARR of California (for himself, Mr. HALL of Ohio, and Mr. HOBSON) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to establish a temporary program to permit professional schools of the Army Training and Doctrine Command to admit civilians as students on a cost-reimbursable, space-available basis.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. TRADOC SCHOOLS CIVILIAN ENROLLMENT INI-**

4 **TIATIVE.**

5 (a) ADMISSION OF CIVILIANS AS STUDENTS.—Chap-
6 ter 407 of title 10, United States Code, is amended by
7 adding at the end the following new section:

1 **“§ 4416. TRADOC schools: admission of civilians**

2 “(a) ADMISSION OF CIVILIANS AS STUDENTS.—(1)

3 The head of a TRADOC school may enter into an agree-
4 ment with an accredited institution of higher education (or
5 a consortium of such institutions) under which students
6 enrolled at an institution of higher education that is a
7 party to the agreement may receive instruction at the
8 TRADOC school on a cost-reimbursable, space-available
9 basis.

10 “(2) The head of a TRADOC school may also permit
11 other persons who would benefit from the instruction pro-
12 vided at the school, as determined by the head of the
13 TRADOC school involved, to receive instruction at the
14 school on a cost-reimbursable, space-available basis.

15 “(b) SELECTION AND ATTENDANCE.—(1) The head
16 of the TRADOC school involved, with the approval of the
17 Secretary of the Army, shall select the persons who will
18 be permitted to receive instruction at the school pursuant
19 to subsection (a). In the case of agreements under sub-
20 section (a)(1), the head of the TRADOC school involved
21 shall consult with the other parties to the agreements to
22 establish qualifications and methods of selection for per-
23 sons to receive instruction at the school.

24 “(2) Except as the head of the TRADOC school in-
25 volved determines necessary, a person who receives in-
26 struction at the school pursuant to subsection (a) shall

1 be subject to the same regulations governing attendance,
2 discipline, discharge, and dismissal as apply to other per-
3 sons attending the school.

4 “(c) RETENTION OF FUNDS COLLECTED.—Amounts
5 collected under subsection (a) to reimburse a TRADOC
6 school for the costs of providing instruction to students
7 under subsection (a) shall be credited as an addition to
8 the appropriation supporting the compensation of instruc-
9 tors at the school.

10 “(d) TRADOC SCHOOL DEFINED.—In this section,
11 the term ‘TRADOC school’ means any one of the following
12 professional schools of the Army Training and Doctrine
13 Command:

14 “(1) The United States Army Logistics Man-
15 agement College.

16 “(2) The Foreign Language Center of the De-
17 fense Language Institute.

18 “(3) The United States Army Engineer School.

19 “(4) The United States Army Quartermaster
20 School.

21 “(5) The United States Army Signal Center
22 and School.

23 “(6) The United States Army Ordnance Center
24 and School.

1 “(e) EXPIRATION OF AUTHORITY.—No student may
2 be admitted to a TRADOC school under subsection (a)
3 to commence classes beginning after September 30,
4 1997.”.

5 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
6 at the beginning of such chapter is amended by adding
7 at the end the following new item:

“4416. TRADOC schools: admission of civilians.”.

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
