Mrs. COLLINS of Illinois introduced the following bill; which was referred jointly to the Committees on Ways and Means and Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to provide payment for dental services under part B of the medicare program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. MEDICARE COVERAGE OF DENTAL SERVICES.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1861(s) of the Social Se-
5 curity Act (42 U.S.C. 1395x(s)) is amended—

6 (1) by inserting “(including dentures)” after
7 “prosthetic devices” in paragraph (8) and striking
8 “internal body” and “(other than dental)” in such
9 paragraph;

1 (2) by striking “and” at the end of paragraph
2 (12);

3 (3) by striking the period at the end of para-
4 graph (14) and inserting “; and”;

5 (4) by inserting after paragraph (14) the fol-
6 lowing new paragraph:

7 “(15) services furnished in connection with the
8 care, treatment, filling, removal, or replacement of
9 teeth or structures directly supporting teeth.”; and

10 (5) by redesignating paragraphs (15) and (16)
11 as paragraphs (16) and (17), respectively.

12 (b) REPEAL OF GROUND FOR EXCLUSION.—Section
13 1862(a) of such Act (42 U.S.C. 1395y) is amended by
14 striking paragraph (12).

15 (c) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Sections 1864(a),
16 1865(a), 1902(a)(9)(C), and 1915(a)(1)(B)(ii)(I) of such
17 Act (42 U.S.C. 1395aa(a), 1395bb(a), 1396a(a)(9)(C),
18 1396n(a)(1)(B)(ii)(I)) are each amended by striking
19 “paragraphs (15) and (16)” and inserting “paragraphs
20 (16) and (17)”.

21 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

22 The amendments made by the first section of this Act
23 shall be applicable with respect to services furnished on
24 or after the first day of the first calendar month which

- 1 begins more than sixty days after the date on which this
- 2 Act is enacted.
