Mr. JOHNSTON of Florida introduced the following bill; which was referred jointly to the Committees on Foreign Affairs and Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To provide that recipients of export promotion assistance should meet certain requirements.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REQUIREMENTS FOR RECIPIENTS OF EXPORT**

4 **PROMOTION ASSISTANCE.**

5 The Secretary of Commerce should not provide as-
6 sistance under any export promotion program to any per-
7 son unless—

8 (1) the person has—

1 (A) made investments in the United States
2 in research, development, and manufacturing;
3 or

4 (B) employs people in the United States;
5 and

6 (2) either—

7 (A) the company is a United States-owned
8 company; or

9 (B) the company is incorporated in the
10 United States and has a parent company which
11 is incorporated in a country which the Sec-
12 retary determines—

13 (i) affords to United States-owned
14 companies opportunities, comparable to
15 those afforded to any other company, to
16 participate in joint ventures;

17 (ii) affords to United States-owned
18 companies local investment and market ac-
19 cess opportunities comparable to those af-
20 farded to any other company; and

21 (iii) affords adequate and effective
22 protection for the intellectual property
23 rights of United States-owned companies.

24 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

25 For purposes of this Act—

1 (1) the term “export promotion program” has
2 the meaning given that term in section 201(d) of the
3 Export Administration Amendments Act of 1985
4 (15 U.S.C. 4051(d)); and

5 (2) the Secretary shall define such other terms
6 as may be necessary to carry out this section.
