Mr. McCANDLESS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide punishments for fleeing Federal law enforcement personnel during the execution of their duties.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Anti-Flight Act of
5 1993”.

6 **SEC. 2. TITLE 18 AMENDMENT.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 73 of title 18, United
8 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the
9 following:

1 **“§ 1518. Fleeing Federal law enforcement officer**

2 “(a) Whoever, while driving a motor vehicle, know-
3 ingly and willfully flees a Federal law enforcement officer
4 in the execution of that officer’s duties shall be fined
5 under this title or imprisoned not more than 5 years, or
6 both.

7 “(b) As used in this section, the term ‘Federal law
8 enforcement officer’ means an individual described in sec-
9 tion 1114 of this title.”.

10 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
11 at the beginning of chapter 73 of title 18, United States
12 Code, is amended by adding at the end the following new
13 item:

“1518. Fleeing Federal law enforcement officer.”.
