A BILL

To clarify the tariff classification of certain plastic flat goods.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN PLASTIC FLAT GOODS.**

4 Chapter 42 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the
5 United States is amended by inserting in numerical
6 sequence the following new subheading with the article
7 description having the same degree of indentation as the
8 article description in subheading 4202.31.60.

1 **SEC. 2. ADDITIONAL NEW NOTE.**

2 The Additional United States notes for chapter 42
3 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States
4 are amended by adding at the end the following new note:
5 “3. For purposes of subheading 4202.32.10, the term ‘re-
6 inforced or laminated plastics’ means (a) rigid, infusible,
7 insoluble plastics formed by the application of heat and
8 high pressure on two or more super-imposed layers of fi-
9 brous sheet material which has been impregnated or coat-
10 ed with plastics, or (b) rigid plastics comprised of
11 imbedded fibrous reinforcing material (such as paper, fab-
12 ric, asbestos, and fibrous glass) impregnated, coated or
13 combined with plastics usually by the application of heat
14 or heat and low pressure.”.

15 **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

16 The amendments made by this Act shall apply with
17 respect to goods entered, or withdrawn from warehouse
18 for consumption, on or after the 15th day after the date
19 of the enactment of this Act.
