To extend the temporary suspension of duty on certain chemicals.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF DUTY ON CERTAIN CHEMI-**
4 **CALS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
6 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
7 amended by striking “12/31/92” and inserting “12/31/96”
8 in each of the following headings:

9 (1) Heading 9902.30.14 (relating to Neville and
10 Winter’s acid).

1 (2) Heading 9902.30.41 (relating to Broenner's
2 acid).

3 (3) Heading 9902.30.42 (relating to D Salt).

4 (4) Heading 9902.30.60 (relating to naphthol AS
5 types).

6 (5) Heading 9902.30.62 (relating to anis base).

7 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
8 this section shall apply with respect to goods entered, or
9 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
10 the 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act.
