## A BILL

To suspend certain requirements until it is determined or agreed that the requirements do not violate the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS**

4 **PENDING GATT DETERMINATION.**

5 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, section  
6 320C of the Act of February 16, 1938, shall not be effec-  
7 tive during the period beginning on the date of enactment  
8 of this Act and ending on the earlier of—

1           (1) the date the United States Trade Rep-  
2           representative enters into an agreement with parties to  
3           the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (re-  
4           ferred to in this section as “GATT”) that have chal-  
5           lenged the compliance of such section with GATT,  
6           stipulating that such section does not violate GATT;  
7           or

8           (2) the date of a final determination, under the  
9           dispute resolution procedure established for GATT,  
10          that such section does not violate GATT.
