Mr. DOLE (for himself and Mr. LIEBERMAN) introduced the following bill;
which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations

A BILL

To remove the embargo on Bosnia and Herzegovina.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. UNITED STATES ARMS EMBARGO OF THE GOV-**
4 **ERNMENT OF BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA.**

5 (a) PROHIBITION.—Neither the President nor any
6 other member of the Executive Branch of the United
7 States Government shall interfere with the transfer of con-
8 ventional arms appropriate to the self-defense needs of the
9 Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

10 (b) TERMINATION.—The President shall terminate
11 the United States arms embargo of the Government of
12 Bosnia and Herzegovina upon receipt from that govern-

1 ment of a request for assistance in exercising its right of
2 self-defense under Article 51 of the United Nations Char-
3 ter.

4 (c) DEFINITION.—As used in this section, the term
5 “United States arms embargo of the Government of
6 Bosnia and Herzegovina” means the application to the
7 Government of Bosnia and Herzegovina of—

8 (1) the policy adopted July 10, 1991, and pub-
9 lished in the Federal Register of July 19, 1991 (58
10 Fed. Reg. 33322) under the heading “Suspension of
11 Munitions Export Licenses to Yugoslavia”; and

12 (2) any similar policy being applied by the
13 United States Government as of the date of receipt
14 of the request described in subsection (a) pursuant
15 to which approval is routinely denied for transfers of
16 defense articles and defense services to the former
17 Yugoslavia.

18 (d) Nothing in this section shall be interpreted as au-
19 thorization for deployment of United States forces in the
20 territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for any purpose, in-
21 cluding training, support, or delivery of military equip-
22 ment.
