# S. 310

To amend title V of Public Law 96–550, designating the Chaco Culture Archeological Protection Sites, and for other purposes.

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## IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

Mr. DOMENICI (for himself and Mr. BINGAMAN) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

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## A BILL

To amend title V of Public Law 96–550, designating the Chaco Culture Archeological Protection Sites, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Chacoan Outliers Pro-  
5 tection Act of 1993”.

6 **SEC. 2. CONFORMING AMENDMENT.**

7 (a) Section 501 of Public Law 96–550 (16 U.S.C.  
8 410ii) is amended in the title by striking “Congressional

1 findings” and inserting in lieu thereof “Congressional  
2 findings and purpose”.

3 (b) Section 501(b) of Public Law 96–550 (16 U.S.C.  
4 410ii(b)) is amended by striking “San Juan Basin;” and  
5 inserting in lieu thereof, “San Juan Basin and surround-  
6 ing areas;”.

7 **SEC. 3. ADDITIONS TO CHACO CULTURE ARCHEOLOGICAL**  
8 **PROTECTION SITES.**

9 Subsection 502(b) of Public Law 96–550 (16 U.S.C.  
10 410ii–1(b)) is amended to read as follows:

11 “(b)(1) Thirty-eight outlying sites as generally de-  
12 picted on a map entitled “Chaco Culture Archeological  
13 Protection Sites”, numbered 310/80,033–B and dated  
14 September 1991, are hereby designated as ‘Chaco Culture  
15 Archeological Protection Sites’. The thirty-eight archeo-  
16 logical protection sites totaling approximately 14,287  
17 acres identified as follows:

1       “(2) The map referred to in paragraph (1) shall be  
2 kept on file and available for public inspection in the ap-  
3 propriate offices of the National Park Service, the office  
4 of the State Director of the Bureau of Land Management  
5 located in Santa Fe, New Mexico, the office of the Area  
6 Director of the Bureau of Indian Affairs located in Win-  
7 dow Rock, Arizona, and the offices of the Arizona and  
8 New Mexico State Historic Preservation Officers.”.

9       **SEC. 4. ASSISTANCE TO THE NAVAJO NATION.**

10       Section 506 of Public Law 96-550 (16 U.S.C. 410ii-  
11 5) is amended by adding the following new subsection at  
12 the end thereof:

13       “(f) The Secretary is directed, subject to appropria-  
14 tions, to assist the Navajo Nation in the protection and  
15 management of those Chaco Culture Archeological Protec-

1 tion Sites located on lands under the jurisdiction of the  
2 Navajo Nation through a grant, contract, or cooperative  
3 agreement entered into pursuant to the Indian Self-Deter-  
4 mination and Education Act (Public Law 93-638), as  
5 amended, to assist the Navajo Nation in site planning, re-  
6 source protection, interpretation, resource management  
7 actions, and such other purposes as may be identified in  
8 such grant, contract, or cooperative agreement.”.

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
