## A BILL

To authorize the transfer of equipment, artifacts, and memorabilia held by the Immigration and Naturalization Service to the Border Patrol Museum and Memorial Library Foundation, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. AUTHORITY.**

4       Notwithstanding section 203 of the Federal Property  
5       and Administrative Services Act of 1949 (40 U.S.C. 484)  
6       or any other provision of law, the Attorney General is au-  
7       thorized to transfer and convey to the Border Patrol Mu-

1 seum and Memorial Library Foundation, incorporated in  
2 the State of Texas—

3           (1) such equipment, artifacts, and memorabilia  
4       held by the Immigration and Naturalization Service,  
5       and

6           (2) such real property of the United States,  
7 as the Attorney General may determine is necessary to  
8 further the purposes of the Museum and Foundation.

9 **SEC. 2. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.**

10       The Attorney General is authorized to provide tech-  
11 nical assistance, through the detail of personnel of the Im-  
12 migration and Naturalization Service, to the Border Pa-  
13 trol Museum and Memorial Library Foundation for the  
14 purpose of demonstrating the use of the items transferred  
15 under section 1.
