Mr. HOLLINGS introduced the following joint resolution; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution relative to contributions and expenditures intended to affect congressional and Presidential elections.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*
3 *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein),*

4 **SECTION 1. CONTRIBUTIONS AND EXPENDITURES IN FED-**
5 **ERAL ELECTIONS.**

6 The following article is proposed as an amendment
7 to the Constitution of the United States, to be valid only
8 if ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
9 States within seven years after the date of final passage
10 of this joint resolution:
