Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Labor and Human Resources.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

FEBRUARY 2 (legislative day, JANUARY 5), 1993

Mr. KENNEDY, from the Committee on Labor and Human Resources, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Labor and Human Resources.

1 *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1
6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
7 the Committee on Labor and Human Resources is author-
8 ized from March 1, 1993, through February 28, 1994, and
9 March 1, 1994, through February 28, 1995, in its discre-
10 tion (1) to make expenditures from the contingent fund

1 of the Senate, (2) to employ personnel, and (3) with the
2 prior consent of the Government department or agency
3 concerned and the Committee on Rules and Administra-
4 tion, to use on a reimbursable or nonreimbursable basis
5 the services of personnel of any such department or
6 agency.

7 SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
8 period March 1, 1993, through February 28, 1994, under
9 this resolution shall not exceed \$5,412,714, of which
10 amount not to exceed \$30,900 may be expended for the
11 procurement of the services of individual consultants, or
12 organizations thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of
13 the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended).

14 (b) For the period March 1, 1994, through February
15 28, 1995, expenses of the committee under this resolution
16 shall not exceed \$5,530,058, of which amount not to ex-
17 ceed \$30,900 may be expended for the procurement of the
18 services of individual consultants, or organizations thereof
19 (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorga-
20 nization Act of 1946, as amended).

21 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
22 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
23 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
24 date, but not later than February 28, 1994, and
25 February 28, 1995, respectively.

1 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
2 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
3 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the commit-
4 tee, except that vouchers shall not be required (1) for the
5 disbursement of salaries of employees paid at an annual
6 rate, or (2) for the payment of telecommunications pro-
7 vided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
8 keeper, United States Senate, or (3) for the payment of
9 stationery supplies purchased through the Keeper of the
10 Stationery, United States Senate, or (4) for payments to
11 the Postmaster, United States Senate, or (5) for the pay-
12 ment of metered charges on copying equipment provided
13 by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper,
14 United States Senate, or (6) for the payment of Senate
15 Recording and Photographic Services.

16 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
17 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
18 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,
19 1993, through February 28, 1994, and March 1, 1994,
20 through February 28, 1995, to be paid from the Ap-
21 propriations account for “Expenses of Inquiries and
22 Investigations”.

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
