Mr. MINGE (for himself, Mr. BLUTE, Mr. BROWDER, Mr. CRAMER, Mr. KLUG, Mr. LIPINSKI, Ms. MCKINNEY, and Mr. QUINN) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Government Reform and Oversight

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of Congress that mediators should be used in discussions between Congress and the President to produce a balanced budget.

Whereas Congress and the President have proposed budget reconciliation plans that balance in 7 years as scored by the Congressional Budget Office;

Whereas negotiations have been suspended and may not be resumed because of disagreements over the details of how to balance the budget;

Whereas the American people have called on the President and Congress to resolve their differences;

Whereas the benefits of balancing the budget may be lost if differences between the parties are not resolved;

Whereas our Nation has successfully mediated disputes in other regions and it is common practice in the private sector to appoint a mediator when negotiations reach an impasse: Now, therefore, be it

2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of Congress that the
3 President and Congress should use mediators to resolve
4 differences over the task of balancing the budget in 7
5 years.
