A BILL

Making emergency supplemental appropriations for additional disaster assistance and making rescissions for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1995, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any
4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pro-
5 vide emergency supplemental appropriations for additional

18 DENIAL OF USE OF FUNDS FOR INDIVIDUALS NOT
19 LAWFULLY WITHIN THE UNITED STATES

20 SEC. 30. (a) IN GENERAL.—None of the funds made
21 available in this Act may be used to provide any direct
22 benefit or assistance to any individual in the United States
23 when it is made known to the Federal entity or official
24 to which the funds are made available that—

25 (1) the individual is not lawfully within the
26 United States; and

1 (2) the benefit or assistance to be provided is
2 other than search and rescue; emergency medical
3 care; emergency mass care; emergency shelter; clear-
4 ance of roads and construction of temporary bridges
5 necessary to the performance of emergency tasks
6 and essential community services; warning of further
7 risks or hazards; dissemination of public informa-
8 tion and assistance regarding health and safety
9 measures; provision of food, water, medicine, and
10 other essential needs, including movement of sup-
11 plies or persons; or reduction of immediate threats
12 to life, property, and public health and safety.

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
