Mr. CASTLE (for himself, Mr. LEACH (both by request), Mr. GONZALEZ, and Mr. FLAKE) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Banking and Financial Services

## A BILL

To extend and reauthorize the Defense Production Act of 1950, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Defense Production  
5 Act Amendments of 1995”.

6 **SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF PROGRAMS.**

7 Section 717(a) of the Defense Production Act of  
8 1950 (50 U.S.C. App. 2166(a)) is amended in the first  
9 sentence by striking “Title I (except section 104), title III,  
10 and title VII (except sections 708, 714, 719, and 721)

1 of this Act, and all authority conferred thereunder, shall  
2 terminate at the close of September 30, 1995” and insert-  
3 ing “Title I (except section 104), title III, and title VII  
4 (except sections 708 and 721), and all authority conferred  
5 thereunder, shall terminate at the close of September 30,  
6 1998”.

7 **SEC. 3. AUTHORIZING APPROPRIATIONS FOR TITLE III**  
8 **PROJECTS.**

9 Section 711 of the Defense Production Act of 1950  
10 (50 U.S.C. App. 2161) is amended—

11 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “(a) AUTHOR-  
12 IZATION.—” and all that follows through “sub-  
13 section (c),” and inserting “(a) AUTHORIZATION.—  
14 Except as provided in subsection (b),”; and

15 (2) by striking subsections (b), (c), and (d) and  
16 inserting after subsection (a) the following new sub-  
17 section:

18 “(b) TITLE III AUTHORIZATION.—There are author-  
19 ized to be appropriated for each of the fiscal years 1996,  
20 1997, and 1998, such sums as may be necessary to carry  
21 out title III.”.
