A BILL

To amend the Legal Services Corporation Act to prescribe an income rule for determining if a client who is a victim of domestic violence is eligible for assistance.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Domestic Violence
5 Legal Services Eligibility Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. INCOME RULE FOR VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIO-**
2 **LENCE.**

3 Section 1007(a) of the Legal Services Corporation
4 Act (42 U.S.C. 2996f(a)) is amended by inserting after
5 and below paragraph (10) the following: “In establishing
6 income levels under paragraph (2)(A) to determine if a
7 client is eligible for assistance, the Corporation, in the case
8 of a client who is the victim of domestic violence, shall
9 prescribe that only the income of such a client will be con-
10 sidered in making such determination. For purposes of the
11 preceding sentence, the term ‘domestic violence’ has the
12 meaning given such term by section 2003(1) of the Omni-
13 bus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1988 (42
14 U.S.C. 3796gg-2(1)).”.

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
