Ms. PRYCE, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 483) to amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to permit medicare select policies to be offered in all States, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 483) to amend title XVIII of the
6 Social Security Act to permit medicare select policies to

1 be offered in all States, and for other purposes. The first
2 reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of
3 order against consideration of the bill are waived. General
4 debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed
5 one hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman
6 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Com-
7 merce. After general debate the bill shall be considered
8 for amendment under the five-minute rule. In lieu of any
9 committee amendment it shall be in order to consider as
10 an original bill for the purpose of amendment under the
11 five-minute rule an amendment in the nature of a sub-
12 stitute consisting of the text of H.R. 1391. That amend-
13 ment in the nature of a substitute shall be considered as
14 read. No amendment to that amendment in the nature of
15 a substitute shall be in order except one further amend-
16 ment in the nature of a substitute which may be offered
17 only by Representative Dingell of Michigan or his des-
18 ignee, shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for
19 one hour equally divided and controlled by the proponent
20 and an opponent, and shall not be subject to amendment.
21 At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amend-
22 ment the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the
23 House with such amendment as may have been adopted.
24 Any Member may demand a separate vote in the House
25 on any amendment adopted in the Committee of the Whole

1 to the bill or to the amendment in the nature of a sub-
2 stitute made in order as original text. The previous ques-
3 tion shall be considered as ordered on the bill and any
4 amendment thereto to final passage without intervening
5 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-
6 structions.

7 SEC. 2. Subject to clause 2(l)(5) of rule XI, the Com-
8 mittee on Commerce may file a report to the House on
9 H.R. 483 at any time.

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
