IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. QUILLEN, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 961) to amend the Federal Water Pollution Control Act.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 961) to amend the Federal Water
6 Pollution Control Act. The first reading of the bill shall
7 be dispensed with. Points of order against consideration
8 of the bill for failure to comply with section 302(f) of the

1 Congressional Budget Act of 1974 are waived. General de-
2 bate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed two
3 hours equally divided and controlled by the chairman and
4 ranking minority member of the Committee on Transpor-
5 tation and Infrastructure. After general debate the bill
6 shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute
7 rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original bill
8 for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule
9 the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended
10 by the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure
11 now printed in the bill. The committee amendment in the
12 nature of a substitute shall be considered by title rather
13 than by section. The first three sections and each title of
14 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute
15 shall be considered as read. Points of order against the
16 committee amendment in the nature of a substitute for
17 failure to comply with clause 7 of rule XVI or clause 5(a)
18 of rule XXI or section 302(f) of the Congressional Budget
19 Act of 1974 are waived. During consideration of the bill
20 for amendment, the Chairman of the Committee of the
21 Whole may accord priority in recognition on the basis of
22 whether the Member offering an amendment has caused
23 it to be printed in the portion of the Congressional Record
24 designated for that purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII.
25 Amendments so printed shall be considered as read. Be-

1 fore consideration of any other amendment it shall be in
2 order to consider the amendment printed in the report of
3 the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution.
4 That amendment may be offered only by a Member des-
5 ignated in the report, may amend portions of the bill not
6 yet read for amendment, shall be considered as read, shall
7 be debatable for ten minutes equally divided and controlled
8 by the chairman and ranking minority member of the
9 Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, shall
10 not be subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to
11 a demand for division of the question in the House or in
12 the Committee of the Whole. If that amendment is adopt-
13 ed, then the committee amendment in the nature of a sub-
14 stitute as so amended shall be considered as original text
15 for the purpose of further amendment. At the conclusion
16 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee
17 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such
18 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may
19 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment
20 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to
21 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute.
22 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
23 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without
24 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with
25 or without instructions.
