Mr. LINDER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1745) to designate certain public lands in the State of Utah as wilderness, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 1745) to designate certain public
6 lands in the State of Utah as wilderness, and for other
7 purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed

1 with. Points of order against consideration of the bill for
2 failure to comply with clause 2(I)(6) of rule XI or section
3 302(f) or 311(a) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974
4 are waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill
5 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
6 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
7 the Committee on Resources. After general debate the bill
8 shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute
9 rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original bill
10 for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule
11 the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended
12 by the Committee on Resources now printed in the bill.
13 The committee amendment in the nature of a substitute
14 shall be considered as read. Points of order against the
15 committee amendment in the nature of a substitute for
16 failure to comply with clause 7 of rule XVI or section
17 302(f) or 311(a) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974
18 are waived. Before consideration of any other amendment,
19 it shall be in order to consider the amendment printed in
20 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this
21 resolution. That amendment may be offered only by the
22 chairman of the Committee on Resources or his designee,
23 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for ten min-
24 utes equally divided and controlled by the proponent and
25 an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall

1 not be subject to a demand for division of the question
2 in the House or in the Committee of the Whole. If that
3 amendment is adopted, the bill, as amended, shall be con-
4 sidered as the original bill for the purpose of further
5 amendment. During further consideration of the bill for
6 amendment, the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole
7 may accord priority in recognition on the basis of whether
8 the Member offering an amendment has caused it to be
9 printed in the portion of the Congressional Record des-
10 ignated for that purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII. Amend-
11 ments so printed shall be considered as read. At the con-
12 clusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the
13 Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with
14 such amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member
15 may demand a separate vote in the House on any amend-
16 ment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill
17 or to the amendment in the nature of a substitute made
18 in order as original text. The previous question shall be
19 considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto
20 to final passage without intervening motion except one
21 motion to recommit with or without instructions.
