A BILL

To reduce Federal spending by prohibiting the backfit of Trident I ballistic missile submarines to carry D-5 Trident II submarine-launched ballistic missiles.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Prohibition on D-5
5 Trident II Backfit Act of 1995”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON D-5 TRIDENT II BACKFIT.**

7 (a) PROGRAM TERMINATION.—The Secretary of De-
8 fense, the Secretary of the Navy and the Commander-in-

1 Chief of United States Strategic Command shall cease all
2 planning for modification of any Trident I submarine to
3 enable that submarine to be deployed with Trident II (D-
4 5) missiles.

5 (b) PROHIBITION OF BACKFIT-RELATED EXPENDI-
6 TURES.—

7 (1) No funds appropriated to the Department
8 of Defense may be obligated for any D-5 missiles,
9 D-5 missile components, ship modifications and ship
10 components that are associated with a D-5 Trident
11 II Backfit program.

12 (2) For purposes of paragraph (1), and D-5
13 missiles beyond number 389, and their related com-
14 ponents (rocket motors, guidance sets, etc.) shall be
15 considered to be associated with a D-5 Trident II
16 Backfit program.

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
